This letter is in response to your letter dated September 17, 2009, regarding the complaint from your constituent, Ms. Kelli Keawe, on spray painting of cars at Capital Body Service (Capital), 1729 Homerule Street, Kalihi. The Department of Health (DOH), Clean Air Branch (CAB), conducted unannounced complaint investigations of Capital on September 11, 2009, March 20, 2009, three inspections in 2008, and four inspections in 2007. During these investigations, inspectors spoke to Mr. Herb Nakanishi, owner of Capital, about the odor complaints and their concerns. Mr. Nakanishi has filters in the spray booth for paint overspray, but the filters do not mitigate the odors. On April 17, 2008, the CAB also met with Ms. Keawe and had a CAB conference call with her sister, Ms. Monticello, who lives in an apartment next to Capital, to discuss their concerns of the odor.

The CAB does not regulate paint spray booths or the paint odors, and we understand that the nuisance odors from the paint spray booths are the concern of your constituents. The City and County of Honolulu, Building Department, had previously approved the building permit for the spray booth which is allowed in a mix-use zoning area and can lead to conflict and frustration due to the incompatible zoning.

On October 7, 2009, Representative Joey Manahan held a meeting to discuss Ms. Keawe's concerns and the problem with the Capital operations. In attendance were Ms. Keawe, her mother, a friend, representatives from the City Building Department, and DOH staff from CAB and the Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response Office. Although the Capital owner has made some attempts to resolve the odor problem, it was noted that he should possibly consider additional measures such as modifying his stack.

Since paint spray booths are occasionally a source of complaints, DOH is conducting a study on the best practices to control the overspray and odors from paint spray booths. Upon completion, the report will be made available to any interested parties.

Please have Ms. Keawe contact the Clean Air Branch at 586-4200 if she has any further questions or the Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response Branch at 586-4249 if there are concerns with the toxicity from the odors of the paint spray booth.

SUBJECT: Capital Auto Service Complaint

This letter is in response to your letter dated September 14, 2007, regarding Capital Auto Service redirecting their paint spray booth exhaust stack toward an apartment building. The Department of Health, Clean Air Branch (CAB), conducted an investigation on September 7 and 18, 2007. At the time of the investigation, there were no vehicles being painted, and therefore the CAB inspector did not detect any odors in the area. Mr. Herbert Nakanishi, the business owner, stated that they had reconfigured and increased the stack height sometime in December 2006, to alleviate a complaint from another business. Although spray booths are not regulated by the CAB, we do respond to complaints and investigate for paint overspray. We will be following up with Capital Auto Service to discuss what mitigative measures Mr. Nakanishi is willing to pursue to address the complaints from the neighboring apartment. The City and County of Honolulu (City), Building Division, has also been contacted to determine whether the modification to the spray booth stack is in compliance with their requirements.

In regards to the complaint filed on September 17, 2007, we were informed by the City, Storm Water Quality Control (768-3250), that a warning letter will be sent to the business for allowing the metal fibers from the sanding of vehicles to be discharged into the storm drain.
