House Concurrent Resolution 181 requests the Department of Land and Natural Resources' (Department), Land Division develop a plan to redirect storm water runoff from state lands adjacent to the Hanapepe Salt Ponds away from the salt pans. Given the State's current fiscal situation, the Department regretfully opposes this measure. Due to the recent severe funding reductions, the Department simply does not have the resources to undertake any new unfunded mandates, despite the meritorious intent of such endeavors. In less than three years, the Department's general fund appropriations have decreased 32%, and the Department's special fund revenues have declined over 35%. In the past year, the Department has lost over 80 positions, which constitutes approximately 10% of the Department's workforce.

Moreover, the Department has made several previous unsuccessful attempts to address the concerns of the interested parties in the area and on at least one occasion has proposed a plan to address the water runoff issues. In 1998, the Department's Historic Preservation program received a Capitol Improvement Program appropriation (Act 289, Session Laws of Hawaii 1993, Item H-2) for \$70,000 to prevent runoff from flowing into the area. The Department's Engineering Division (then known as the Division of Water and Land Development) designed and contracted improvements that called for protective berms to be constructed around the salt ponds. However, due to objections from Kauai County, the project was cancelled and the plan was never implemented.
