STRONGLY URGING THE GOVERNOR, BOARD OF EDUCATION, DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND THE HAWAII STATE TEACHERS ASSOCIATION TO RE-OPEN NEGOTIATIONS TO REDUCE FURLOUGH FRIDAYS.

Your favorable consideration is requested on these resolutions that may serve to encourage management and labor to re-open collective bargaining talks to reduce, or eliminate, furloughs and increase teaching days.

For the committee's information, I recently sent out a legislative survey to constituents in the 19<sup>th</sup> House District, Kaimuki-Waialae-Kahala. In response to the question, should we require 180 school days/year to prevent teacher furloughs, the answers have been running 80% in favor. There is clear sentiment to reduce furlough days.

The public schools in the 19<sup>th</sup> District are: Kalani High, Kaimuki Intermediate, Wilson Elementary, Waialae Charter, Lili'uokalani Elementary, and Liholiho Elementary.

Dear Chair Takumi, Co-chair Berg, Chair Rhoads, Co-chair Yamashita, and Committee Members,

I am in favor of HCR 267/HR192 urging the Governor, the Board of Education, the Department of Education, and the Hawaii State Teachers Association to reopen negotiations to reduce furlough Fridays.

With 163 teaching days, Hawaii has the shortest school year in the nation. Good education is the basis for our strong economy, building a skilled workforce. We need to be competitive with other states, and having the shortest school year is not the way to do this!

Additionally, having to hire a babysitter or miss work for furlough Fridays is a strain on working parents, particularly since Hawaii's families often have both parents working.

Shortening the school year also threatens Federal funding for our schools, which seems to defeat the purpose of saving state monies!

I urge you to vote favorably on this measure.
