TO THE HONORABLE ANGUS MCKELVEY, CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

My name is Ron Boyer, Acting Director of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Department"). The Department appreciates the opportunity to provide testimony in support of these resolutions.

Google's "Fiber for Communities" experiment proposes to bring 1-gigabit-persecond internet speed to one or more U.S. locations on a trial basis. House Concurrent Resolution 297 and House Resolution 214 urge Google to select Hawai'i as a test site for conducting its gigabit broadband initiative.

The Department concurs that Hawai'i would make an optimal location for Google to demonstrate the revolutionary benefits of high speed broadband, given the strong
