HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 297 URGING GOOGLE INC. TO SELECT HAWAII AS A TEST SITE TO CONDUCT THE GOOGLE GIGABIT BROADBAND INITIATIVE

TO THE HONORABLE CAROL FUKUNAGA, CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

My name is Ron Boyer, Acting Director of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Department"). The Department appreciates the opportunity to provide testimony in support of this resolution.

Google's "Fiber for Communities" experiment proposes to bring 1-gigabit-persecond internet speed to one or more U.S. locations on a trial basis. House Concurrent Resolution 297 urges Google to select Hawai'i as a test site for conducting its gigabit broadband initiative.

The Department concurs that Hawai'i would make an optimal location for Google to demonstrate the revolutionary benefits of high speed broadband, given the strong

community interest, government support, near universal penetration of cable television, and the higher than average subscription rates for broadband usage.

In fact, representing the State, the Department worked collaboratively with the four counties to submit a joint application on March 25 to Google. Under this partnership, the State and county governments are prepared to provide regulatory relief where possible to facilitate the deployment of an ultra-high speed broadband network. In addition, the application also calls for comprehensive partnerships with both the public and private sectors of Hawai'i's community, as well as accelerated development of applications to benefit the state.

Our application touts Hawai'i's unique and diverse choices where a Google network might be deployed citing Hawai'i's broad spectrum of urban and rural communities with a diversity of social-economic populations residing within a variety of terrains, climates and topographies.
