- 4. Decreasing drug use
- 5. Increasing health education and training opportunities for community members
- 5. Increasing the number of health care providers working in rural areas
- 6. Increasing cultural sensitivity of providers

Therefore we are fully in support of recognition of the important role of caregivers in providing for the needs of our rural communities.
