WRITTEN COMMENTS ON SENATE BILL NO. 1332, S.D. 1, RELATING TO HEALTHCARE.

TO THE HONORABLE DONNA MERCADO KIM, CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

My name is Celia Suzuki, Program Specialist of the Professional and Vocational Licensing Division, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("DCCA"). The DCCA appreciates the opportunity to present written comments in opposition to Senate Bill No. 1332, S.D. 1, Relating to Healthcare.

This bill proposes to regulate the practice of respiratory care by establishing a state respiratory care board and licensure requirements within DCCA. The DCCA has numerous concerns with the bill which have been subsequently presented to and shared with, the previous subject matter committee chairs in the form of a proposed S.D. 2.

We oppose this bill because in 1995, the Auditor conducted a sunrise analysis on the regulation of respiratory care therapists and the Auditor reported that regulation is not warranted. The report said that if improperly performed, respiratory care can cause harm. However, regulation is not necessary because sufficient protections already exist.

Should this bill continue to move forward and your Committee finds that the regulation of respiratory care practitioners is necessary, the DCCA needs to stress that additional costs will be incurred to administer this program. A cost analysis was provided to your Committee staff on February 21, 2009. We would ask for your favorable consideration for the staffing and the funding to implement this new regulatory program.
