**PURPOSE:** The purpose of S.B. 1668, S. D. 2, is to establish eligibility requirements for aged, blind, temporarily incapacitated, and disabled persons to receive public assistance.

DEPARTMENT'S POSITION: The Department of Human Services (DHS) respectfully opposes this bill. Although we support the idea of possibly combining the Aid to the Aged, Blind and Disabled (AABD) program and the General Assistance (GA) program, due to fiscal constraints, it is not prudent to pursue this bill at this time. Further, combining these two programs is premature at this time because we do not have sufficient data about these recipients and their circumstances to make informed decisions about the suitable criteria for a combined program. The Department has been and will continue to work closelywith the Financial Assistance Advisory Committee (FAAC) toward a combined program but we need the opportunity to gather and analyze relevant data to develop a combined program. The Department hopes to is submit a proposal, supported by the FAAC, during the 2010 Legislative Session which will ensure that the requirements for both the AABD and the GA programs are clearly defined, compatible, reasonable and sustainable in combining these two important programs.
