Chair John Mizuno, Vice Chair Tom Brower, and Members of the House Human Services Committee, thank you for hearing **SB 2076**.


The State Commission on Fatherhood strongly supports SB 2076, which increases the terms of members of the State Commission on Fatherhood from two (2) to four (4) years.
