SB 2110 SD2 RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Chairs Cabanilla and Ito, Vice Chairs Chong and Har, and members of the Committees:

The Administration <u>supports the intent</u> of SB 2110 SD2 and recommends <u>amending</u> the bill to reduce the timeframe for the issuance of non-discretionary ministerial permits for approved affordable housing projects from 60 to 45 days.

SB 2110 SD2 provides for the expedited construction of affordable housing by creating a 60-day timeframe for the issuance of any ministerial permit associated with an approved affordable housing project.

The Administration strongly supports the creation of standard timeframes for the development of affordable housing. Although there is currently a process in place that allows government agencies to approve affordable housing project proposals through an expedited track, ministerial permits that are issued subsequent to project approval may take significant amounts of time before they are issued. The current regulatory system for the construction of a housing project in Hawaii can take seven years or more

to complete from the initial presentation of a project, to construction. Therefore, standard timeframes can serve as an important guide for government agencies.

The Administration prefers that the bill be amended to establish a 45-day timeframe as proposed in the original bill and in the Administration-sponsored bill; SB 2679. A 45-day timeframe is based on a proposal developed over an eighteen month period by the Affordable Housing Regulatory Barriers Task Force, which was made up of stakeholders such as affordable housing developers, nonprofit organizations, academic, legislators, and state and county housing and planning agencies.

Subject: Senate Bill No. 2110, SD2
Relating to Affordable Housing

The Department of Planning and Permitting has **serious concerns** regarding Senate Bill No. 2110, SD2. Although the SD2 version addresses some of the concerns identified in our testimony for previous hearings on the original version of the measure, the bill continues to impose a deadline on counties for issuance of any ministerial permit for an affordable housing project.

The deadline imposition impinges on the counties' ability to perform the necessary reviews to ensure that a project satisfies all the applicable statutory requirements and receives a properly issued permit. In order to meet the deadline as mandated by this measure, the counties may need to forego some reviews or rush reviews with the probability of mistakes happening that could compromise public health and safety. As a result, the counties may be exposed to increased liability. To protect against this liability, the bill should be amended by adding the following subsection:

(c) No lawsuit or action shall be prosecuted or maintained against the counties, its officials and employees as a result of actions taken to review and issue any ministerial permit within the deadline specified in this section.

Accordingly, without the above proposed change, we object to Senate Bill No. 2110, SD2 and recommend that it be filed.
