Thank you for the opportunity to submit American Organization of Nurse Executives (AONE Hawaii) Hawaii Chapter's testimony in strong support of SB2272 Relating to Continuing Education for Nurses which would require nurses license in the State to complete fifteen (15) hours of continuing education during each two-year license period as a requirement for license renewal.

The complex healthcare needs of our patients and aging population validates the need for nurses to regularly update their knowledge. Nursing care includes the assessment of the physical, social, biological, and behavioral aspects of a patient. The healthcare environment is constantly evolving and continuing education is an effective avenue for nurses to keep up to date with these changes.

Hawaii is one of the 18 states that do not require continuing education in order for the nurses to renew their license. Many states require physicians, nurses, pharmacist and social workers to obtain continuing education credits as a condition of their license renewal.
