In consideration of SENATE BILL 2363 RELATING TO CONSERVATION OUTREACH

Senate Bill 2363 would require the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) to work with the Department of Transportation to establish and maintain airport kiosks to provide conservation information on the Hawaiian monk seal, and how to behave if one is encountered, information on Hawaii's unique and fragile ecosystems, how to care for these ecosystems, print and video information sources, and endangered species laws. No new source of funding is identified to support these activities. While the Department is concerned with the decline in the population of monk seals and recognizes the need to educate the population about how better to protect this species, the Department nonetheless strenuously opposes any unfunded mandates or distractions from its core public resources management.

The Department's general fund appropriations have decreased more than 32% in less than three years, its special fund income has decreased more than 35% in less than three years, and the Department has lost more than 80 positions, more than 10% of our positions this past year. The Department therefore cannot afford to undertake any new initiatives.

SENATE BILL NO. 2363 RELATING TO CONSERVATION OUTREACH

The Department of Transportation (DOT) opposes this bill that would require DOT to work with the Department of Land and Natural Resources to establish and maintain airport kiosks to provide conservation information on the Hawaiian monk seal, and how to behave if one is encountered; information on Hawaii's unique and fragile ecosystem, how to care for these ecosystems; print and video information sources and endangered species laws. No new source of funding is identified to support these activities. Presently, this educational effort is already being undertaken with informative and educational agricultural/nature displays at the Kahului Airport. With the assistance from the Department of Agriculture and the Federal Aviation Administration this educational project is in direct support of the Invasive Species Action Plan.

While the Department is concerned with the ultimate protection of our endangered species and the state's pristine ecosystems with the fundamental need to educate the population, the Department opposes any further unfunded mandates to support this ongoing objective.
