Title of Bill:	SB 2451 RELATING TO EDUCATION.
Purpose of Bill:	Requires remote schools to be allocated funds using categorical
	allotments, rather than through the weighted student formula. Defines a
	remote school as any public school within a school complex that has the
	only public high school within a fifteen-mile radius or on an island.
Department's Position:	The Department of Education does not support this bill, because the bill
	would require creation of additional categorical programs outside of the
	Weighted Student Formula (WSF). Some rural school communities
	with small enrollments have raised concerns regarding the viability of their
	schools under the per pupil allocation. There are ten high schools that are
	more than 15 miles away from the nearest high school. If these ten
	schools, and all of the schools in their complexes were all exempted from
	WSF, a total of 33 schools would be removed from the WSF. If the
	schools and their current FY 2010-11 WSF allocation removed from the
	WSF total, the impact on the value of 1.0 student would decrease from
	\$3,506.66, which is being used for the financial plans for next school year,
	to \$3,492.58, or a decrease of \$14.08 for the students in schools that are
	not as geographically isolated before any other weighting factors are
	considered. The actual impact on the value of 1.0 student will likely be
	even greater than the \$14.08 cited above, because the remote schools
	would probably say that their FY11 WSF allocation is insufficient and
	additional funds should be moved from WSF to categorical programs.
	The Department will work with the Committee on Weights to develop a
	recommendation regarding changes to the WSF allocation methodology
	that will consider the needs of geographically remote schools.
