Good evening Chair Marcus Oshiro and Members of the Finance Committee,

I am writing to offer comments to SB 2534, SD 2, HD 1: The Department of Public Safety (PSD) would require correctional facilities to accept cash bail and bail bonds, when the courts are closed to the discharge of of a prisoner from custody or imprisonment. This procedure would need staff who are bonded, to collect the bail (cash, surety, bail bonds), and the administration would need to grant access to the correctional facilities.

I am recommending that all agencies affected (county, state correctional facilities, and the courts) form a working task force to develop a plan to accomplish the task, and protocols necessary to collet the bail in a cost effective savings process.
