Testimony in **support** of S.B. No. 2586 and S.B. No. 2704.

Chair Sakamoto, Vice Chair Kidani, and Members of the Committee:

Aloha, I am Maunalei Love, executive director of the Charter School Administrative Office ("CSAO"). I want to thank the chair and the entire committee for the time and effort being spent to remedy the issue of adequately providing needed resources to all public schools and making Hawaii more competitive for the Race to the Top grant.

We support the intent of both SB 2586 and SB 2704 requiring the Charter School Review Panel (CSRP) to determine a clear process with rigorous criteria for charter schools to be reauthorized on a regular basis. We support allowing the Charter School Administrative Office (CSAO) to directly withhold funds from the EDN 600 allocation for its operational expenses, including salaries for staff and the executive director. The CSAO also supports providing transparent accountability for charter schools and repealing the cap on the number of charter schools. The CSAO particularly supports ensuring that charter school students receive equitable funding along with facilities funding and access. Also supported at the national level both by the US DOE and the National Charter School Alliance is having multiple public charter school authorizers as reflected in the National Alliance's Model Law.

While we support the intent of SB2704 to improve the charter schools within the public education system by restructuring its governance, we cannot support converting the executive director into a deputy superintendent and placing the CSAO within the department under the current structure. Such a move would seriously compromise the autonomy of the charter schools and hinder many of the reformative measures taking place at Hawaii's charter schools.

We do support these bills for the changes they make towards providing equitable funding and a supportive environment for all DOE and public charter schools to better position Hawaii in competition for U.S. Department of Education's Race to the Top (RTT) initiative. States with policies in place supporting equitable funding and facilities for all

public school students are at greater competitive advantage to qualify for RTT and other federal grant programs.

The CSAO is ready, willing, and able to help with any revisions to clarify the details in these drafts. Thank you for this opportunity to testify.

Aloha Senators,

My daughter is in the 4th grade and attends Kawaikini New Century Public Charter School on the Island of Kaua`i. Kawaikini is now in its 2nd year of operation.

My daughter went from a population of 900 in a K-5 Public DOE School to a population of 92 in K-12 Public Charter School. At the DOE school, she was anonymous to all but her immediate teachers. At her Charter School, she is known and loved and cared for by <u>all</u> the administration and teachers. This safe and caring environment sets the stage for success for her and all the students. Charter Schools, with smaller populations, offer a small student-teacher ratio leading to effective teaching and successful learning.

I am a very involved and engaged parent and I highly value the Public Charter School environment. The small environment fosters connection and parents are empowered to become engaged because the effects of their involvement are obvious and immediate.

But I am disheartened that the school has to struggle with the extremely small budget each year. Every teacher at Kawaikini is top-notch. They are hindered in their potential as teachers because they don't have the budget to obtain the tools for their profession. Our administration is small and going above and beyond to ensure the success of Kawaikini. Our administration, our teachers and our keiki deserve more!

Public Charter Schools have the potential to turn education around in our state, but without adequate per pupil funding, they are limited in their growth and movement. As a parent, it makes no sense that the former public school would receive much higher funding for her enrollment than does her current public school.

Kawaikini's partner non-profit is doing their part in seeking funding to create permanent facilities and even in these lean economic times, are still hopeful and moving forward.

For the State's part, a realistic per pupil funding equal to that of DOE schools would help Kawaikini and all Public Charter Schools keep on track for our keiki to reach their fullest potential.

Please support SB2704 which will give Charter Schools equitable funding.

I am also a staunch supporter of the revitalization of the Hawaiian language as I am also a staff member of the Ka Haka ÿUla O Keÿelikölani College of Hawaiian Language at the University Hawaiÿi at Hilo. It is imperative that Public Charter Schools (PCS) such as those that employ the immersion philosophy continue to receive funding support. Without these schools our children would be forced to be attend public schools that may not support such philosophy. I, myself, being a product of the public school system, has see the difference that these types of immersion programs have on my childrens' lives, granted they are still young, however, they are so finely intuned with their cultural identity, surmisedly impart by speaking their mother tongue. Comments:

I am in general support of SB2704. I agree with lifting the cap on start up charters (the current statute allows for 25 conversions of which there are currently five) however, it does not assure an increase in charters unless the annual budget allows for expansion. An " economic" cap on charters exists with static or decreasing allocations to a steadily increasing amount of charter students meaning less money per pupil. The demand exists: charter schools have an accumulated list of approximately 3,000 students on waiting lists to gain entry to existing charter schools.

I agree with the idea of multiple authorizors, the governor appointing the CSRP members instead of the BOE, equal funding compared to department students, and federal funding not being automatically being eliminated from charters. There is more work to be done to insure an equitable distribution of EDN 150, because presently there are non-SPED costs imbedded in EDN 150 that are supposed to be sevicing the general student population. If EDN 150 is to be automatically eliminated from the funding formula of charter schools, all non-SPED costs need to be distributed to EDN 100 under Weighted Student Formula.

One main ingredient lacking in this bill is addressing the urgent need of start up charters to receive some form of facilities support. Zero dollars and zero support is unconstitutional. I refer to the opening statement in Article X of the State Constitution which provides for the facilities (thereof) for public education. The facility allocation formula language presently imbedded in Section 302-B8 of the statute needs to be moved to the funding part of the law 302-b12 and the word " may" changed to " shall" provide facilities funding. We appreciate the discussion taking place and are fully aware of the State's finacial situation. But unless some of these inequities in public education are mitigated, the State will be forfeiting the chance for hundreds of millions of dollars in education reform movements like Race to the Top. Remember, the President's first initiative was health care reform and he is turning his efforts towards education. Let's start preparing our State to qualify. Thank you for this opportunity to testify.

The Center for Educational Reform gave Hawaii Charter School law a D grade in evaluating our state's ability to compete for Race to the Top Funding. Three areas are hindering this ability to compete. I'm speaking to one of these areas: "an ambiguous commitment to equitable funding for students at public charter schools." The public charter schools of Hawaii are doing an excellent job educating Hawaii's children and yet, since their inception, they've been functioning with approximately half the funding per student that students in non-charter public schools receive. This is basically and patently unfair to both students and teachers in the charter schools. I understand that the reason for this inequality is that charter schools are allowed to seek other funding through such sources as grants. As you well know, however, grant writing takes a fantastic amount of time and energy—time and energy which could and should instead be devoted to teaching, and even then funding of the grants is not guaranteed.
