RE: SENATE BILL NO. 271 SDI, RELATING TO TOURISM EMERGENCY

Chair Mercado Kim, Vice Chair Tsutsui, and Members of the Committee:

The Maui Chamber of Commerce, a business organization whose mission it is to advance and promote a healthy economic environment for business, advocating for responsive government and quality education, while preserving Maui's unique community characteristics, supports SB 271 SD1, relating to Tourism Emergency.

We are a membership driven organization comprised of over 900 members, 88% of which are small businesses with fewer than 25 employees, representing nearly 21,000 employees. We support this bill as it adds a national or global economic crisis to situations considered a tourism emergency and requires, in addition to the governor's declaration of the existence of a tourism emergency, the governor's express approval and direction before action may be taken.

The Maui Chamber of Commerce understands the value and significance of the visitor industry and believes that more support and appreciation is needed for this industry which greatly contributes to our economy. We are in favor of measures that help to sustain and grow the visitor industry and enhance visitor experiences.

Any decline in this sector harms all businesses, including small businesses that solely rely on tourism.

Therefore, we believe it is critical for the visitor industry to be able to quickly respond to emergency situations to best position the industry. This bill provides a mechanism to do just that and will help us mitigate potential negative outcomes in the future.
