Protection of uhu and weke optimal reproductive size and bag limits is critical at this time.

This solution is better than the pending DLNR/DAR herbivore enhancement/replenishment legislation that entails no-take zones. I think this is so because local fishermen are more inclined to follow bag and size limits than a seasonal "kapu" that has no termination date: the Kahekili HEA bill, for example. Finally, the success of any fish protection is only as good as the enforcement capability. Thus, hire local fishermen to patrol the waters and deputize them to write citations for violations.
