Background & Summary

Brief Description of Applicant

The Hawai'i Primary Care Association (HPCA), incorporated in 1988, is a private, nonprofit corporation under the laws of the State of Hawai'i. Our mission is to improve the health of communities by advocating for, expanding access to, and sustaining high quality care through the statewide network of community health centers. HPCA's unique role is to create a forum for health center collaboration and act as chief collective voice for community health centers with policy-makers and the public, manage subcontracted funds to the community health centers for various purposes, provide diverse training and technical assistance opportunities, lead efforts in acquisition and use of health information technology, and support projects that enhance healthcare access and quality. HPCA's agenda to improve and expand access and quality through community health centers in Hawai'i is as follows:

- Maintaining and strengthening existing Community Health Centers.
- Support expansion of existing and development of new Community Health Centers.
- Surveillance of Community Health Center needs and the health care environment.
- Assist with training, recruitment and retention and other workforce needs.
- Provide a forum for collaboration and serve as a liaison to other agencies.
- Improve clinical quality and monitoring of clinical outcomes.
- Leverage and increase resources that support Community Health Centers and the underserved.

Goals and Objectives Related to Request

The **goal** of this request is to significantly increase access to primary dental health services for adults covered by Medicaid/Med-QUEST who have only emergency dental benefits.

The **objective** is to subsidize the cost of primary dental care services provided to adults covered by Medicaid/Med-QUEST. Services will be available at FQHCs on six islands. We estimate that the funds will provide services for up to 3,500 adult Medicaid/Med-QUEST enrollees during fiscal year 2011.

Public Purpose and Need Served by Program

Two essential public purposes are served by this proposed program:

- Humanitarian. Because Medicaid-eligible adults are, by definition, low income they cannot
 afford to pay for essential dental services. This program will provide access to this necessary
 care and reduce unnecessary suffering and economic loss among people already disadvantaged.
- Economic. Costs for medical problems related to untreated dental problems will be reduced for the Medicaid program. These may include premature births due to periodontal disease and heart conditions exacerbated by uncontrolled dental infections, among others.

Target Population

The target population for this program is adults covered by the Medicaid or Med-QUEST programs.

Geographic Coverage

Our project will work through federally qualified health centers that have a statewide presence, serving one third of all Hawaii Medicaid/Med-QUEST enrollees on six islands.

Service Summary and Outcomes

Scope of work, tasks, responsibilities

The Hawaii Primary Care Association will subcontract with all interested federally qualified health centers to provide primary dental care services for Medicaid/Med-QUEST covered adults.

Patients who are eligible will be adults enrolled in Medicaid/Med-QUEST programs.

Services provided may include primary and preventive dental services.

Timeline

Services will be provided during fiscal year 2011.

Quality Assurance and Evaluation

HPCA's subcontracts with FQHCs will specify reporting requirements associated with payment. See specific measures below. HPCA will monitor subcontractor performance by requiring data in quarterly reports submitted for reimbursement.

HPCA is uniquely able to support performance improvement as indicated by FQHC reports and program monitoring as we are also the only organization in Hawaii whose mission and federal resources are aimed at improving community health center capacity, including primary dental care.

Measures of Effectiveness

Activities subcontractors will be required to report will include:

- Specific patient demographic information; and
- Number and type of clinical visit.

Additional clinical outcomes to be measured will be negotiated with the Department of Health. Measures selected will be aligned with DOH priorities, meaningful use requirements, and data required by the federal government from all FQHCs.

Reports will be submitted to the Department of Health on a quarterly basis that indicate activity levels, performance on agreed-upon measures, and any problems or changes encountered.

- Chief Operating Officer Kathy Suzuki-Kitagawa, who has worked with HPCA since 2000 and functions as contracts and compliance officer.

 Performance monitoring and improvement staff will be primarily Robert Hirokawa and Cristina Vocalan who have public health, epidemiology, and clinical credentials.

Additional support staff will ensure data collection, in-put, reporting, and fiscal management and control.
