A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SMALL BOAT HARBORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 200-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: "§200-9 Purpose and use of state small boat harbors. 3 4 State small boat harbors are constructed, maintained, and 5 operated for the purposes of: Recreational boating activities; 6 (1)7 (2) Landing of fish; and 8 Commercial vessel activities. (3) 9 [For the purpose of this-section, "recreational boating 10 activities means the utilization of watercraft for sports, 11 hobbies, or pleasure, and "commercial vessel activities" means 12 the utilization of vessels for activities or services provided 13 on a fee basis. To implement these purposes, only vessels in 14 good material and operating condition that are regularly 15 navigated beyond the confines of the small boat harbor, and 16 which are used for recreational activities, the landing of fish, 17 or commercial vessel activities shall be permitted to moor, 18 anchor, or berth at such harbor or use any of its facilities. 1	(b) Vessels used for purposes of recreational boating		
2	activities which are also the principal habitation of the owners		
3	shall occupy no more than one hundred twenty-nine berths at Al		
4	Wai boat harbor and thirty-five berths at Keehi boat harbor,		
5	which is equal to fifteen per cent of the respective total		
6	moorage space that was available as of July 1, 1976, at the Ala		
7	Wai and Keehi boat harbors. Notwithstanding the purposes of		
8	small boat harbors, moorage for commercial vessels and		
9	commercial vessel activities is not permitted in the Ala Wai and		
10	Keehi boat harbors; provided that commercial catamarans, for		
11	which valid permits or registration certificates have been		
12	issued by the department which allow the catamarans to operate		
13	upon Waikiki shore waters for hire, may be permitted to moor in		
14	Ala Wai boat harbor at facilities leased for commercial		
15	purposes. The department shall allow a sole proprietor of a		
16	catamaran operating with a valid commercial registration		
17	certificate issued by the department for a commercial catamaran		
18	to land its commercial catamaran on Waikiki beach and to operate		
19	upon Waikiki shore waters for hire, to transfer the ownership of		
20	the vessel from personal ownership to corporate or other		
21	business ownership without terminating the right to operate		
22	under the commercial registration certificate. The existing		

- 1 commercial registration certificate shall be reissued in a
- 2 timely manner in the name of the transferee corporation or other
- 3 business entity. No commercial registration issued to an owner
- 4 of a commercial catamaran operating in the Waikiki area shall be
- 5 denied or revoked without a prior hearing held in accordance
- 6 with chapter 91.
- 7 (c) Notwithstanding any limitations on commercial permits
- 8 for Maui county small boat facilities, vessels engaging in
- 9 inter-island ferry service within Maui county shall be afforded
- 10 preferential consideration for ferry landings, including the
- 11 issuance of a commercial operating permit and the waiver of any
- 12 applicable fees, at Maui county small boat facilities; provided
- 13 that:
- 14 (1) The vessel operator has been issued a certificate of
- public convenience and necessity for the purpose of
- 16 engaging in inter-island ferry service that includes a
- 17 route within Maui county;
- 18 (2) The design and performance characteristics of the
- 19 vessel will permit safe navigation within the harbor
- 20 entrance channel and safe docking within Maui county
- 21 small boat facilities;

1	(3)	The vessel operations will not result in unreasonable
2		interference with the use of Maui county small boat
3		facilities by other vessels; and
4	(4)	All preferential consideration and waivers, including
5		any commercial permits issued under this section,
6		shall cease upon the vessel operator's termination of
7		inter-island ferry service within Maui county.
8	(d)	The chairperson may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 93
9	to furthe	r implement this section.
10	<u>(e)</u>	For purposes of this section:
11	"Com	mercial vessel activities" means the use of vessels for
12	activitie	s or services provided on a fee basis.
13	"Rec	reational boating activities" means the use of
14	watercraft	t for sports, hobbies, or pleasure.
15	<u>"Reg</u> ı	ularly navigated" means the movement of a vessel under
16	its own po	ower from its assigned mooring within a small boat
17	harbor to	beyond the confines of the small boat harbor and
18	entrance o	channel at least once in a ninety-day period. Vessels
19	moored in	an offshore mooring area shall exit the confines of
20	the design	nated mooring area under their own power at least once
21	in a ninet	cy-day period."

- SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 1
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
