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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FEES FOR HABITAT CONSERVATION PLANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that Hawaii hosts the SECTION 1. 2 greatest concentration of threatened and endangered species in 3 Increased development throughout the State, while the country. 4 beneficial to the State in many regards, has the potential to 5 adversely affect threatened and endangered species. The 6 legislature has provided a means to permit desirable activities 7 that may cause incidental take of threatened and endangered 8 species through the establishment of incidental take licenses 9 and habitat conservation plans pursuant to chapter 195D, Hawaii 10 Revised Statutes.

11 Incidental take licenses authorize take of threatened and 12 endangered species in cases where take is incidental to an 13 otherwise lawful activity; provided that the applicant obtains 14 approval of a habitat conservation plan that identifies and 15 implements measures to avoid, minimize, mitigate, and monitor 16 take of those species, and that will increase the likelihood of 17 recovery of the endangered or threatened species that are the 18 focus of the plan.

1 The department of land and natural resources is responsible 2 for evaluating, processing, and approving habitat conservation 3 plans and incidental take licenses to ensure compliance with 4 requirements under chapter 195D, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 5 Chapter 195D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, provides that the 6 department may establish a technical assistance program to 7 assist landowners with habitat conservation plans. The 8 department has established such a program, and the technical 9 assistance that is required is specialized in nature and labor 10 intensive, requiring consultation with expert staff, endangered 11 species biologists, and land managers. 12 The number of applications for incidental take licenses and

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requests for technical assistance related to habitat
conservation plans have increased significantly in recent years.
The demand for the technical assistance program cannot be met
under the department's current budget.

17 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the department of 18 land and natural resources to collect fees and payment for costs 19 incurred by the technical assistance program associated with 20 assisting landowners in the development, review, and monitoring 21 of habitat conservation plans, and adopt rules for establishing 22 such fees.

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1 SECTION 2. Section 195D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted 3 and to read as follows: 4 ""Technical assistance program" means a program that 5 includes department staff designated to assist landowners in 6 developing, reviewing, or monitoring habitat conservation plans 7 by providing technical assistance." SECTION 3. Section 195D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 9 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows: 10 "(d) The department may establish a habitat conservation 11 technical assistance program to assist landowners in developing, 12 reviewing, or monitoring habitat conservation plans by providing 13 technical assistance. The department may collect fees and 14 payment for costs incurred for use of the technical assistance 15 program in the development, review, or monitoring of a specific 16 habitat conservation plan. Fees shall be charged at an hourly 17 rate of \$50. The fees and payment for costs collected pursuant to this subsection shall be deposited into the endangered 18 19 species trust fund established under section 195D-31." 20 SECTION 4. Section 195D-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 21 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

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"{a) 1 There is established within the state treasury a 2 trust fund to be known as the endangered species trust fund to 3 be administered by the department to implement the purposes of this chapter. 4 5 The fund shall consist of moneys from the following 6 sources: (1)Moneys accrued from the sale of retail items 7 officially sponsored by the department for the fund; 8 Private contributions for the management and recovery (2)9 10 of Hawaii's unique plants and animals; 11 (3)Fees and assessments charged for the commercial use of 12 public land and waters and designated for the fund; Penalties, fines, or auctions resulting from 13 (4)14 enforcement violations; 15 Legislative appropriations; and (5) Moneys deposited to implement the obligations of a 16 (6) 17 habitat conservation plan [or], as security for habitat conservation plan funding [-,], or technical 18 assistance program fees and payment for costs incurred 19 20 for use of the technical assistance program as set 21 forth in section 195D-23(d)."

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SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and staricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
