A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. During the 2005 Special Session, the legislature adopted Act 8, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2005 2 (Act 8), to create the Hawaii 2050 task force to review the 3 Hawaii state plan and the State's planning process. The office 4 5 of the auditor was required to prepare and submit to the legislature the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan. In enacting 6 7 Act 8, the legislature expressed its belief that government is responsible for resolving daily and immediate issues and public 8 9 needs, while providing guidance to assure a sustainable future and outlook. 10

The creation of the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan comes 11 12 as the State faces a growing number of pressing issues, 13 including the steady deterioration of public infrastructure, the 14 lack of affordable housing, a continued reliance on a service-15 based economy, the vulnerability of Hawaii in a volatile global 16 energy market, possible interruptions in travel and to critical food supplies, threats to fragile island ecosystems, ever-17 increasing numbers of residents, and an increasing number of 18 2011-2319 SB283 CD1 SMA.doc

Chapter 226, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to part III to be appropriately 4 5 designated and to read as follows: 6 Sustainability. Priority guidelines and "§226-7 principles to promote sustainability shall include: 8 Encouraging balanced economic, social, community, and (1) environmental priorities; 9 10 (2) Encouraging planning that respects and promotes living within the natural resources and limits of the State; 11 -12 Promoting a diversified and dynamic economy; (3) Encouraging respect for the host culture; 13 (4) 14 (5) Promoting decisions based on meeting the needs of the 15 present without compromising the needs of future 16 qenerations; Considering the principles of the ahupuaa system; and 17 (6) Emphasizing that everyone, including individuals, 18 (7) 19 families, communities, businesses, and government, has the responsibility for achieving a sustainable 20 Hawaii." 21

1 SECTION 3. Section 226-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately 2 inserted and to read as follows: 3 ""Ahupuaa" means a traditional native Hawaiian resource and 4 5 behavioral management system that ensures respect for the air, land, water, and other scarce natural resources that make life 6 sustainable from the mountains to the sea. 7 "Kanaka maoli" means native Hawaiians. 8 9 "Sustainability" means achieving the following: 10 (1)Respect of the culture, character, beauty, and history of the State's island communities; 11 Striking a balance between economic, social, 12 (2) community, and environmental priorities; and 13 Meeting the needs of the present without compromising 14 (3) the ability of future generations to meet their own 15 needs." 16 SECTION 4. Section 226-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended to read as follows: 18 "§226-102 Overall direction. SECTION 5. The university of Hawaii public policy center, 5 in consultation with the office of planning, shall submit a 6 status and progress report to the legislature no later than 7 December 21, 2011, that identifies the progress made in 8 implementing the sustainability guidelines and principles set **9** forth in this Act and any recommendations for legislation or 10 other actions to facilitate the full implementation of the 11 sustainability guidelines and principles set forth in this Act. 12 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 14 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011. 15
