## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to improve access to 2 the full range of health care services to medicaid and QUEST 3 members accessing services through a mobile medical van by ensuring that medicaid and QUEST health plans have the 4 5 flexibility to provide appropriate health services via technological means such as telehealth. This flexibility is 6 7 especially important because a new mobile medical van will begin providing services to the more remote areas of Hawaii. Allowing 8 9 QUEST and medicaid members to access services through the mobile 10 medical van will assist in improving the health of those with 11 chronic conditions as well as improving the overall health of 12 area residents.

13 SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 15 and to read as follows:

16 "<u>\$346-</u> <u>Telehealth services; medicaid and QUEST. (a)</u>
17 <u>The department shall implement a mobile medical van telehealth</u>

1	primary care provider, including but not limited to an advanced			
2	practice registered nurse, and shall be equipped with telehealth			
3	capabilities to consult with other health care providers, as			
4	determined to be medically necessary.			
5	(b) This section shall not require the department to cover			
6	patient self-referrals to providers outside of the mobile			
7	medical van program.			
8	(c) This section shall not require the department to cover			
9	any new service.			
10	(d) This section shall apply only to a mobile medical van			
11	program operating in a county with a population of less than two			
12	hundred fifty thousand and shall include a program operated by			
13	Kona community hospital through a partnership with a non-profit			
14	mutual benefit society operating in the State that provides			
15	health care coverage to at least six hundred thousand members.			
16	(e) For the purposes of this section, "telehealth" means			
17	the use of a telecommunications service, as defined in section			
18	269-1, including real-time video conferencing-based			
19	communication, secure interactive and non-interactive web-based			
20	communication, and secure asynchronous information exchange, to			
21	transmit patient medical information, including diagnostic-			
22	quality digital images and laboratory results for medical			
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1	interpretation and diagnosis, for the purpose of delivering			
2	enhanced health care services and information to parties			
3	separated by distance. A standard telephone contact, facsimile			
4	transmission, or an electronic message, in combination or by			
5	itself, does not constitute a telehealth service for the			
6	purposes of this section."			
7	SECTION 3. (a) At least six months but no later than			
8	twelve months after the mobile medical van telehealth pilot			
9	program begins operations, the department of human services			
10	shall assess the implementation of the pilot program pursuant to			
11	section 2 of this Act.			
12	(b) The assessment shall consider the following			
13	information regarding telehealth utilization and outcomes:			
14	(1) Day and time of day of utilization;			
15	(2) Provider types consulted;			
16	(3) Whether a patient had an established relationship with			
17	a provider, including whether the provider was the			
18	patient's primary care provider;			
19	(4) Summary of provider diagnoses;			
20	(5) All services ordered by the provider in response to			
21	the encounter (e.g., number of prescriptions and			
22	specific medications prescribed);			
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1	(6)	Mode of online care conversation (e.g. Internet,
2		including video conferencing and web chat, or IVR
3		phone);
4	(7)	Demographic of the patient who used the online care;
5		and
6	(8)	Patient and provider satisfaction of the online care
7		system and patient satisfaction rating of the
8		provider.
9	(c)	The department shall determine whether to continue,
10	expand, o	r end the mobile medical van telehealth pilot program
11	based on	the results of the department's assessment.
12	SECT	ION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
14	provided	that this Act shall be repealed on June 30, 2013.
