A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF THE SHERIFF.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the sheriff division
of the department of public safety shoulders responsibilities
that are integral to preserving the public peace and safety.
Specifically, the division:

5	(1)	Serves and protects the public, government officials,
6		and state personnel and property under its
7		jurisdiction, including at state facilities, lands,
8		and airports, and within the jurisdictional boundaries
9		of the State, by providing law enforcement services
10		that incorporate patrols, surveillance, and
11		educational activities;
12	(2)	Protects state judges and judicial proceedings,
13		secures judicial facilities, safely handles detained
14		persons, and provides secure transport for persons in

15 custody; and

16 (3) Executes arrest warrants for the judiciary and the17 Hawaii paroling authority.

4		capable of supporting and maintaining the function of
5		the sheriff division;
6	(2)	Study the feasibility and essential need to create a
7		new department of the sheriff that would assume the
8		duties and functions of the sheriff division of the
9		department of public safety; and
10	(3)	Create a plan for the establishment of a new
11		department only if the aforementioned task force study
12		determines that the new department is feasible,
13		essential, and capable of supporting and maintaining
14		the duties and functions of the sheriff division.
15	SECT	ION 2. (a) There shall be established a task force
16	that shall	1:
17	(1)	Determine whether the department of public safety is
18		capable of supporting and maintaining the duties and
19		functions of the sheriff division;
20	(2)	Determine whether it is feasible and essential to
21		create a department of the sheriff; and

2		and essential, create a plan to establish a new
3		department of the sheriff with functions presently

7		in section 3 of this Act. The plan shall also include
8		a process for implementation of the plan to establish
9		a department of the sheriff.

11	(1)	The sheriff, or the sheriff's designee, to serve as

13	(2)	The director of public safety, or the director's
14		designee;
15	(3)	The director of human resources development, or the

18	(5)	The attorney general, or the attorney general's

1 (7) The executive director of the Hawaii Government 2 Employees Association, or the executive director's 3 designee. 4 (C) The task force shall report its findings and 5 recommendations, including proposed legislation, if any, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 6 7 the regular session of 2012. If the task force finds that the 8 creation of a department of the sheriff is feasible and 9 essential, the report shall include cost estimates to establish 10 the department of the sheriff. 11 (đ) The task force shall cease to exist on May 1, 2012. 12 SECTION 3. For purposes of determining whether it is 13 feasible and essential to establish the department of the 14 sheriff pursuant to section 2 of this Act, the task force shall 15 consider the inclusion of the following broad functions in that 16 department: 17 (1)Preserving the public peace, preventing crime, 18 detecting and arresting offenders against the law, 19 protecting the rights of persons and property, and 20 enforcing and preventing violation of all laws and administrative rules of the State as the sheriff deems 21 22 necessary or desirable or, upon request, to assist

1		other state officers or agencies that have primary
2	×	administrative responsibility over specific subject
3		matters or programs;
4	(2)	Providing for the protection and safety of the people
5		of Hawaii through law enforcement at state facilities,
6		lands, harbors, and airports, and within the
7		jurisdictional boundaries of the State;
8	(3)	Receiving and processing arrestees at the district and
9		circuit courts and for the neighbor islands, at the
10		respective county police department receiving desks,
11		and transporting them to appropriate agencies and
12		authorized individuals;
13	(4)	Training, equipping, maintaining, and supervising the
14		force of deputy sheriffs and other employees of the
15	÷	department; and
16	(5)	Performing other law enforcement activities as may be
17		required by law, including the service of warrants.
18	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
