RELATING TO PREPAID HEALTH CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the health and well-being of Hawaii's residents and families are paramount. 2 Consequently, for over thirty years, the Hawaii Prepaid Health 3 Care Act has protected the welfare of the people of Hawaii, 4 offering residents unparalleled access to health care benefits 5 and services. The Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act has 6 accomplished this through various mandates, such as requiring 7 employers who employ one or more full-time employees to provide 8 health insurance, setting the standards for health care coverage 9 in Hawaii, limiting the amount that employees must contribute to 10 premiums, and requiring employees to accept coverage unless 11 covered under another health insurance plan (e.g., a spouse's 12 plan). This has resulted in Hawaii having robust health care 13 plans, low uninsured rates, and some of the lowest premiums in 14 the country. While Hawaii experiences some of the same issues 15 relative to access, quality, and cost as other states across the 16 country, the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act has ensured system 17 stability throughout the State. 18 2011-2108 HB1134 SD2 SMA.doc

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1 The legislature further finds that at the time the Hawaii 2 Prepaid Health Care Act was enacted, the legislature anticipated 3 future federal health care reform legislation. Thus, the Hawaii 4 Prepaid Health Care Act included a termination clause in the event such federal legislation was passed. Section 393-51, 5 6 Hawaii Revised Statutes, states: 7 This chapter shall terminate upon the effective date .8 of federal legislation that provides for voluntary 9 prepaid health care for the people of Hawaii in a 10 manner at least as favorable as the health care 11 provided by this chapter, or upon the effective date of federal legislation that provides for mandatory 12 13 prepaid health care for the people of Hawaii. 14 The legislature further finds that in 1993, the 15 newly-installed Clinton administration launched health care reform onto the national agenda. Concerned that the federal law 16 17 would jeopardize the quality of health care that people enjoyed 18 in Hawaii because of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act, the 19 legislature enacted Act 99, Session Laws of Hawaii 1994, which 20 repeals the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act's termination clause upon the effective date of any federal act permitting an 21 22 amendment of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act. 2011-2108 HB1134 SD2 SMA.doc

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1	While the Clinton health care reform did not materialize,
2	national health care reform finally became a reality with the
3	enactment of the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care
4	Act in 2010. Although the Patient Protection and Affordable
5	Care Act generally provides for individual and employer health
6	care coverage, it acknowledges the success of Hawaii's prepaid
7	health care model by providing for the continuance of the Hawaii
8	Prepaid Health Care Act in Section 1560(b) of the Patient
9	Protection and Affordable Care Act, as follows:
10	Nothing in this title (or an amendment made by this
11	title) shall be construed to modify or limit the
12	application of the exemption for Hawaii's Prepaid
13	Health Care Act (Haw. Rev. Stat. §§ 393-1 et seq.) as
14	provided for under section 514(b)(5) of the Employee
15	Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (29 U.S.C.
16	1144(b)(5)).
17	The legislature is supportive of the Patient Protection and
18	Affordable Care Act and the efforts of the President and United
19	States Congress to bring the nation closer to achieving
20	universal health care. However, the legislature continues to
21	believe that the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act provides
22	superior benefits for the people of Hawaii, and the legislature

1	is wary that current efforts to repeal or amend the federal
2	Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act may jeopardize the
3	Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act. Therefore, the legislature
4	believes it is imperative to eliminate all provisions for and
5	references to the termination of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care
6	Act.
7	SECTION 2. Act 99, Session Laws of Hawaii 1994, is
. 8	repealed.
9	SECTION 3. Chapter 393, part V, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
10	is repealed.
11	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
