## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PLANNING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that given Hawaii's SECTION 1. 2 limited natural resources, the implementation of smart growth principles, including the preservation of open space, is crucial 3 4 to the sustainability of the islands. There are ten principles 5 of smart growth: 6 (1) Creating a range of housing opportunities and choices; 7 Creating walkable neighborhoods; (2) Encouraging community and stakeholder collaboration; 8 (3) Fostering distinctive, attractive communities with a 9 (4)10 strong sense of place; 11 (5) Making development decisions predictable, fair, and 12 cost-effective: 13 (6) Mixing land uses; 14 Preserving open space, farmland, natural beauty, and (7)critical environmental areas; 15 16 Providing a variety of transportation choices; (8)

- (9) Strengthening and directing development toward
  existing communities; and
- 3 (10) Taking advantage of compact building design.
- 4 Smart growth principles are most successful when the State
- 5 makes systemic changes that are consistent with these principles
- 6 in community planning and development as well as land
- 7 preservation. Several other states have implemented similar
- 8 programs successfully. For example, Maryland has implemented a
- 9 series of legislation promoting smart growth, and Florida has
- 10 implemented a greenways and trails program to provide more
- 11 recreational opportunities and venues.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to promote smart growth and
- 13 sustainability in the State by requiring the office of planning
- 14 to develop a plan to establish a statewide system of greenways
- 15 and trails.
- 16 SECTION 2. (a) The office of planning shall develop a
- 17 plan to establish a statewide system of greenways and trails
- 18 that shall consist of individual greenways and trails and
- 19 networks of greenways and trails.
- 20 (b) The office of planning shall:

ł	(1)	Coordinate with the department of transportation and
2		the department of land and natural resources in its
. 3		efforts to develop a plan for a statewide system of
4		greenways and trails;
.5	(2)	Seek input from the counties regarding:
6		(A) The establishment of a system of greenways and
7		trails for each county;
8		(B) The areas in each county that may be appropriate
9		to designate as a greenway or trail; and
10		(C) The various impediments to establishing a system
11		of greenways and trails in each county;
12	(3)	Investigate and explore other jurisdictions that have
13	•	established and implemented a system of greenways and
14		trails;
15	(4)	Investigate and consider, in consultation with the
16		department of transportation, the use of
17		transportation enhancement funds to establish and
18		implement a statewide system of greenways and trails;
19		and
20	(5)	Establish a timeline for implementing a statewide
21		system of greenways and trails.

- 1 (c) The office of planning shall submit a written report
- 2 to the legislature of its findings and recommendations,
- 3 including any proposed legislation, no later than twenty days
- 4 prior to the convening of the regular session of 2012.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
