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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATIONAL DENTAL HYGIENE EXAMINATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 447-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	"§44	7-1 Who may become dental hygienists; fees. (a) Any	
4	person:		
5	(1)	Eighteen years of age or over;	
6	(2)	Holding and having a diploma or proper certificate of	
7		graduation from a dental hygiene school accredited by	
8		the American Dental Association [(A.D.A.)] Commission	
9		on Dental Accreditation requiring at least a two year	
10		course, recognized by the board of dental examiners;	
11		[and]	
1 2	(3)	Having been officially certified in the administration	
13		of intra-oral infiltration local anesthesia and intra-	
14		oral block anesthesia by an accredited dental hygiene	
15		school or by a certification program previously	
16		approved by the board; <u>and</u>	
17	(4)	Having passed the National Board Dental Hygiene	

Examination;

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upon written application made to and filed with the board may be
 examined for qualification as a dental hygienist.

The application [for examination] shall be accompanied by the applicant's certificate of graduation from an accredited dental hygiene school [together-with], documentary proof of the applicant's certification in the administration of intra-oral infiltration local anesthesia and intra-oral block

anesthesia[-], and documentary proof of the applicant's passage 8 9 of the National Board Dental Hygiene Examination. At the time of filing the application, the applicant shall pay to the board 10 an application [and examination fees,] fee, which [fees,] 11 together with all other fees or charges in this chapter, shall 12 be as provided in rules adopted by the director of commerce and 13 consumer affairs pursuant to chapter 91, and shall be deposited 14 to the credit of the compliance resolution fund established 15 pursuant to section 26-9(o). 16

17 The board shall require an applicant to take and pass (b) 18 the State's examination or one of the following four regional 19 clinical examinations given after February 1, 2005, by [+] the: [The] Western Regional Examining Board; 20 (1)(2) [The] Central Regional Dental Testing Service, Inc.; 21 [The] Southern Regional Testing Agency, Inc.; or 22 (3)

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1 (4) [The] North East Regional Board of Dental 2 Examiners[+], Inc. 3 (c) [Once a national examination is available,] In addition to the requirements in subsection (a), an applicant 4 shall take and pass [the] a national clinical examination $[\tau]$ 5 once such a national clinical examination is available and 6 neither the state examination nor any regional examination shall 7 be accepted; provided that an applicant who has taken and passed 8 the state or a regional examination after February 1, 2005, but 9 prior to the availability of a national examination shall be 10 11 deemed to have met the board's examination requirement. (d) If the applicant successfully passes the examination, 12 the applicant shall be licensed to practice as a dental 13 hygienist in the State. Every licensed dental hygienist, before -14 entering practice, shall pay the board a license fee. On or 15 before December 31 of each odd-numbered year, every licensed 16 dental hygienist desiring to begin or continue to practice in 17 the State shall pay to the board a fee for the biennial 18 19 licensure thereof. The failure, neglect, or refusal of any duly 20 licensed dental hygienist to pay the biennial licensure fee shall constitute a forfeiture of the license, but the license 21

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may be restored upon written application therefor and payment to
 the board of a restoration fee.

(e) An applicant's or licensed dental hygienist's 3 competence to administer intra-oral infiltration local 4 anesthesia shall be demonstrated by certification in the 5 6 administration of intra-oral infiltration local anesthesia by an accredited dental hygiene school or by a certification program 7 previously approved by the board. In addition, an applicant's 8 9 or licensed dental hygienist's competence to administer intra-10 oral block anesthesia shall be demonstrated by proof of successful completion of a course of study in accordance with 11 standards provided for in this chapter $[\tau]$ and the issuance of a 12 certificate or other program documentation listing the intra-13 oral block anesthesia categories in which the applicant or 14 licensed dental hygienist has acquired knowledge and 15 proficiency. 16

17 The applicant or licensed dental hygienist shall also
18 submit documentation of the course content when submitting the
19 certificate. The board shall certify that the applicant or
20 licensed dental hygienist has met the requirements of this
21 chapter; provided that the licensed dental hygienist's
22 administration of intra-oral block anesthesia shall be under the

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direct supervision of a licensed dentist and shall be for those 1 2 categories of intra-oral block anesthesia listed on the course 3 of study certificate submitted to the board. 4 (f) No person shall practice dental hygiene, either gratuitously or for pay, or shall offer or attempt so to 5 6 practice, or shall advertise or announce publicly or privately as being prepared or qualified so to practice $[\tau]$ without having 7 a license as provided in this section [provided, nor shall any]. 8 A licensed dental hygienist shall practice [except] only under 9 the supervision of a licensed dentist as provided in this 10 chapter [provided]." 11 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 13 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 14 15 Calving. National dental hygiene examination

Description:

Amends the requirements of licensure for dental hygienists by specifying that the passage of the National Dental Hygiene Examination is a requirement for licensure.

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JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Commerce and Consumer Affairs

TITLE: RELATING TO NATIONAL DENTAL HYGIENE EXAMINATIONS.

PURPOSE: The bill amends the requirements of licensure for dental hygienists by specifying that the passage of the National Board Dental Hygiene Examination is a requirement for licensure. Technical non-substantive amendments are also proposed.

MEANS: Amend section 447-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION: The National Board Dental Hygiene Examination is a didactic examination developed and administered by the American Dental Association Joint Commission on National Dental Examinations and is required for licensure by all states, except Hawaii. It is highly recommended that it be taken prior to graduation by most accredited dental hygiene schools.

> Although specified as a requirement of licensure for dental hygienists in the administrative rules of the Board of Dental Examiners ("Board"), due to an oversight this provision was never enacted in the statute.

Therefore, this bill would enact in the statute what is required by all other states. The passing of both the didactic and clinical examinations are required for licensure.

<u>Impact on the public</u>: This bill protects the public and would remove any doubt that passage of the National Board Dental Hygiene Examination is required for licensure of dental hygienists in Hawaii.
