## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 27-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"[+]\$27-43[+] Information technology; chief information
4	officer; information technology steering committee;
5	establishment; responsibilities. (a) There is established
6	within the office of the governor a full-time chief information
7	officer to organize, manage, and oversee statewide information
8	technology governance, including supervision and oversight of
9	the information and communication services division of the
10	department of accounting and general services. The chief
11	information officer shall be appointed by the governor as
12	provided in section 26-34. The chief information officer shall
13	report directly to the governor and, in conjunction with the
14	information technology steering committee, shall:
15	(1) Develop, implement, and manage statewide information
16	technology governance;
17	(2) Develop, implement, and manage the state information

technology strategic plans;

1	(3)	Develop and implement statewide technology standards;
2	(4)	Report annually to the governor and the legislature or

5	(5)	Perform other necessary or desirable functions to

7	(6)	Employ persons exempt from chapters 76, 78, and 89.
8	(b)	There is established an information technology
9	steering	committee to assist the chief information officer in
10	developin	g the State's information technology standards and
11	policies,	including but not limited to:
12	(1)	Assisting the chief information officer in developing
13		and implementing the state information technology
14		strategic plans;
15	(2)	Assessing executive branch departments' progress in
16		meeting the objectives defined in the state
17		information technology strategic plans and identifying
18		best practices for shared or consolidated services;
19	(3)	Ensuring technology projects are selected based on
20		their potential impact and risk to the State, as well
21	•	as their strategic value;

1,	(4)	Ensuring that executive branch departments maintain

7	(6)	Clarifying the roles, responsibilities, and authority

9		division, specifically as it relates to its statewide
10		duties.
11	The 1	members of the information technology steering
12	committee	shall be appointed in equal number by the senate
13	president	and speaker of the house of representatives [in equal
14	number] .	respectively, and shall include representatives from
15	executive	branch departments, including large user agencies such
16	as the de	partment of education and the University of Hawaii; the
17	judiciary	; the legislature; and private individuals. The chief
18	informatio	on officer shall serve as the chair of the committee
19	and shall	ensure that the committee is evaluated periodically.
20	(c)	There is established within the department of [budget
21	and financ	ee] accounting and general services a special fund to

- 1 administered and expended by the chief information officer for 2 the purposes of this subsection. per cent of the receipts 3 collected from special funds pursuant to section 36-27 shall be 4 deposited into the shared services technology special fund. Any 5 law to the contrary notwithstanding, the moneys in the fund 6 shall be used to fund the operations of the chief information 7 officer and the information technology steering committee, 8 including the employment and training of staff and any other 9 activities deemed necessary by the chief information officer to 10 carry out the purposes of this section. 11 (d) The chief information officer and the comptroller may 12 raise funds to defray administrative costs and may accept donations of money and personal property on behalf of the 13 14 information technology steering committee; provided that all 15 donations accepted from private sources shall be expended in the **16** manner prescribed by the contributor, and all moneys received 17 from all sources shall be deposited into the information 18 technology steering committee trust account of the shared 19 services technology special fund. 20 The chief information officer shall submit an annual 21 report to the governor and the legislature no later than twenty 22 days prior to the convening of each regular session of the

Section 36-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 9 "(b) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the **10** director shall deposit per cent of all moneys collected 11 pursuant to subsection (a) into the shared services technology **12** special fund established pursuant to section 27-43." 13 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 15 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and 16 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal **17** year 2012-2013 for deposit into the shared services technology 18 special fund established pursuant to section 27-43, Hawaii 19 Revised Statutes. 20 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the shared services technology special fund established pursuant to section 21 22 27-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the sum of \$ or so

- ${f 6}$  activities deemed necessary by the chief information officer.
- 7 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 8 of accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

## Report Title:

Information Technology; Chief Information Officer; Shared Services Technology Special Fund; Appropriation

## Description:

Authorizes the chief information officer to employ persons not subject to chapters 76, 78, and 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes; transfers the shared services technology special fund from the department of budget and finance to the department of accounting and general services, specifies a percentage from special funds for deposit into the fund, and establishes a trust account in the fund; authorizes the chief information officer and comptroller to raise funds and accept donations for the fund; requires the chief information officer to submit annual reports; appropriates funds. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)
