# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOPED INSTRUCTION PERMITS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Section 286-110, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 1. amended by amending subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows: 2 3 "(d) Except when operating a [motor scooter] moped, motor scooter, or motorcycle, the holder of an instruction permit 4 shall be accompanied by a person who is twenty-one years of age 5 6 or older and licensed to operate the category of motor vehicles 7 in which the motor vehicle that is being operated belongs. The licensed person shall occupy a passenger seat beside the permit 8 9 holder while the motor vehicle is being operated; provided that 10 if the holder of the instruction permit is under the age of eighteen years and is driving between the hours of 11:00 p.m. 11 and 5:00 a.m.: 12

(1) A licensed driver who is the permit holder's parent or
guardian shall occupy a passenger seat beside the
driver while the motor vehicle is operated, unless the
permit holder is an emancipated minor;

#### Description:

Clarify laws relating to operating a moped, motor scooter, or motorcycle with an instruction permit.

#### JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Transportation

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO INSTRUCTION PERMITS.

PURPOSE: Clarify that moped instruction permit holders may practice riding their mopeds without being accompanied by a person who is twentyone years of age or older and licensed to operate a moped.

MEANS: Amend section 286-110(d) and (e), Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The current law allows a permit holder to JUSTIFICATION: operate a motor scooter or motorcycle without being accompanied by a person who is 21 years old or older but due to a lack of an exemption, requires this accompaniment for permit holders who operate a moped. The reason an exception is necessary is that carrying a passenger on a two-wheeled vehicle is more challenging and therefore more dangerous than riding alone. Carrying a passenger on a moped would be even more challenging, because a moped is lighter and less powerful. Also, current law prohibits passengers on two-wheeled mopeds. The law must be amended so it is practical and logical.

Impact on the public: Persons with an instruction permit will be able to legally practice riding their mopeds.

Impact on the department and other agencies: There will be no impact on the Department of Transportation. It will save the police departments the frustration of trying to enforce a law that does not make sense.
