# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII NATIONAL GUARD.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Last year, President Barack Obama selected
- 2 Honolulu as the site for the annual Asia-Pacific Economic
- 3 Cooperation Leaders Meeting in November 2011. The Asia-Pacific
- 4 Economic Cooperation is the premier forum for cooperation among
- 5 Asia-Pacific economies on trade and investment issues.
- 6 The annual Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation gathering is
- 7 one of the world's largest intergovernmental meetings and is
- 8 attended by heads of state, cabinet ministers, the heads of the
- 9 World Bank and World Trade Organization, and other business
- 10 leaders. This will be the (largest such gathering in Hawaii's
- 11 history.
- 12 Scheduled for the week beginning November 13, 2011, the
- 13 meetings will be very beneficial for Hawaii's economy, as they
- 14 are expected to draw more than ten thousand people to Honolulu
- 15 and will provide a boost to the State's struggling tourism
- 16 industry.
- 17 High profile events, such as the Asia-Pacific Economic
- 18 Cooperation meetings, carry many security concerns. With 2011-1708 HB1107 SD1 SMA.doc



- 1 security preparations already underway, it is in the State's
- 2 best interest to maximize its security resources.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to authorize members of the army
- 4 and air national guard to use electric guns to support civil
- 5 authorities in disaster relief, civil defense, or law
- 6 enforcement functions.
- 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 121, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 9 and to read as follows:
- 10 "\$121- Use of electric guns. Members of the army or air
- 11 national guard who have been gualified by training and are
- 12 authorized by their commanders may use electric guns, as
- 13 specifically provided in section 134-16(c) and (d), when
- 14 assisting civil authorities in disaster relief, civil defense,
- 15 or law enforcement functions; provided that "training" for the
- 16 purposes of this section means a course of instruction or
- 17 training in the use of any electric gun authorized pursuant to
- 18 this section, that is provided or authorized by the manufacturer
- 19 or is manufacturer-approved or is a electric gun training
- 20 program approved by the army or air national guard, prior to
- 21 deployment or issuance of electric guns and related equipment in
- 22 public."

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1	SECTION 3. Section 134-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended by amending subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows:	
3	"(C)	This section shall not apply to [law]:
4	(1)	<u>Law</u> enforcement officers of county police
5		departments[ <del>, law</del> ];
6	(2)	<u>Law</u> enforcement officers of the department of public
7		safety[ <del>, and conservation</del> ];
8	(3)	Conservation and resources enforcement officers of the
9	•	department of land and natural resources[, or
10		vendors];
11	(4)	Members of the army or air national guard when
12		assisting civil authorities in disaster relief, civil
13		defense, or law enforcement functions; or
14	(5)	<u>Vendors</u> providing electric guns to [those entities;]
15		the individuals described in paragraphs (1) through
16		<u>(4);</u>
17	provided that electric guns shall at all times remain in the	
18	custody and control of the law enforcement officers of the	
19	county police departments, the law enforcement officers of the	
20	department of public safety, $[\Theta r]$ the conservation and resources	
21	enforcement officers of the department of land and natural	
22	resources[-], or the members of the army or air national guard.	
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1	(d) The county police departments of this State, the		
2	department of public safety, [and] the department of land and		
3	natural resources, and the army and air national guard shall		
4	maintain records regarding every electric gun in their custody		
5	and control. The records shall report every instance of usage		
6	of the electric guns; in particular, records shall be maintained		
7	in a similar manner as for those of discharging of firearms.		
8	The county police departments, the department of public safety,		
9	[and] the department of land and natural resources, and the arm		
10	and air national guard shall annually report to the legislature		
11	regarding these records no later than twenty days before the		
12	beginning of each regular session of the legislature."		
13	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
15	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.

### Report Title:

National Guard; Non-Lethal Weapons; Electric Guns
