A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BEVERAGE CONTAINER SURCHARGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that education is one of 2 the foremost priorities of this State. Our State is eligible to 3 compete for funds ranging from \$20,000,000 to \$75,000,000 through a \$4,350,000,000 federal grant program for schools 4 5 called the Race to the Top fund. However, recent school 6 furloughs jeopardized Hawaii's chances of receiving a Race to 7 the Top grant because the furloughs were perceived as directly 8 contradicting Hawaii's stated commitment to reform education, 9 one of the criteria to receive the grants.

10 Although the length of Hawaii's school year has been 11 reinstated, the legislature finds that it is necessary to 12 identify additional sources of revenue to substantiate Hawaii's 13 commitment to public education and improve its likelihood of 14 receiving a Race to the Top grant.

15 The purpose of this Act is to:

16 (1) Add a beverage container surcharge of 5 cents to the
17 deposit beverage container fee;



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1	(2)	Establish an education special fund into which the
2		beverage container surcharge shall be deposited; and
3	(3)	Authorize the department of education to expend moneys
4		in the education special fund to fund improvements in
5		education and the repair and maintenance of public
6		school facilities.
7	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
9	and to re	ad as follows:
10	" <u>§</u> 30.	2A- Education special fund. (a) There is
11	establish	ed in the state treasury an education special fund to
12	be administered by the department, into which shall be deposited	
13	all revenues from the beverage container surcharge as authorized	
14	by section	n 342G The moneys in the education special fund
15	shall be	administered and used by the department to fund
16	improveme	nts in education and the repair and maintenance of
17	public school facilities. Appropriations or authorizations from	
18	the fund shall be expended by the superintendent. Up to ten per	
19	cent of t	he moneys in the special fund may be used by the
20	departmen	t of education to reimburse the department of health
21	for the a	dministrative costs of collecting the beverage
22	container	surcharge."



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1	SECTION 3. Chapter 342G, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§342G- Beverage container surcharge. Beginning on		
5	September 1, 2011, there shall be added to the fee assessed in		
6	section 342G-102, a beverage container surcharge to be collected		
7	and deposited into the education special fund as established		
8	under section 302A The beverage container surcharge shall		
9	be 5 cents per deposit beverage container."		
10	SECTION 4. The department of education shall report to the		
11	governor and the legislature, no later than twenty days prior to		
12	the convening of the regular sessions of 2013 and 2014, on all		
13	expenditures made from the education special fund during the		
14	previous year.		
15	SECTION 5. The department of health shall report to the		
16	legislature on recommendations and implementation of the		
17	beverage container surcharge no later than twenty days prior to		
18	the convening of the regular session of 2013.		
19	SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.		



SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
 and shall be repealed on June 30, 2015.
