#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PREPAID HEALTH CARE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that the health and SECTION 1. 2 wellbeing of our residents and families is paramount. 3 Consequently, for over thirty years, the Hawaii Prepaid Health 4 Care Act has protected the welfare of the people of Hawaii, 5 offering residents unparalleled access to care benefits and 6 The Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act has accomplished services. this through various mandates, such as requiring employers who .7 employ one or more full-time employees to provide health 8 insurance, setting the standards for health care coverage in 9 Hawaii, limiting the amount that employees must contribute to 10 premiums, and requiring employees to accept coverage unless 11 12 covered under another health insurance plan (e.g., a spouse's 13 This has resulted in Hawaii having robust health care plan). plans, low uninsured rates, and some of the lowest premiums in 14 the country. While Hawaii experiences some of the same issues 15 16 relative to access, quality, and cost as other states across the 17 country, the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act has ensured system 18 stability throughout the State.



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1 The legislature further finds that at the time the Hawaii 2 Prepaid Health Care Act was enacted, the legislature anticipated 3 future federal health care reform legislation. Thus, the Hawaii 4 Prepaid Health Care Act included a termination clause in the 5 event such federal legislation was passed. Section 393-51, 6 Hawaii Revised Statutes, states:

7 This chapter shall terminate upon the effective date 8 of federal legislation that provides for voluntary 9 prepaid health care for the people of Hawaii in a 10 manner at least as favorable as the health care 11 provided by this chapter, or upon the effective date 12 of federal legislation that provides for mandatory 13 prepaid health care for the people of Hawaii.

14 The legislature further finds that, in 1993, the newly-15 installed Clinton administration launched health care reform 16 onto the national agenda. Concerned that the federal law would 17 jeopardize the quality of health care that people enjoyed in 18 Hawaii because of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act, the 19 legislature enacted Act 99, Session Laws of Hawaii 1994, which 20 repeals the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act's termination clause upon the effective date of any federal act permitting an 21 22 amendment of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act.



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While the Clinton reform did not materialize, national 1 2 health care reform finally became a reality with the enactment of the federal Affordable Care Act in 2010. Although the 3 4 Affordable Care Act generally provides for individual and 5 employer health care coverage, it acknowledges the success of 6 Hawaii's prepaid health care model by providing for the continuance of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act in Section 7 1560(b) of the Affordable Care Act, as follows: 8 Nothing in this title (or an amendment made by this 9 title) shall be construed to modify or limit the 10 application of the exemption for Hawaii's Prepaid 11 Health Care Act (Haw. Rev. Stat. §§ 393-1 et seq.) as 12 provided for under section 514(b)(5) of the Employee 13 Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (29 U.S.C. 14 15 1144(b)(5). The legislature is supportive of the Affordable Care Act 16

17 and the efforts of the President and United States Congress to 18 bring the nation closer to achieving universal health care. 19 However, the legislature continues to believe that the Hawaii 20 Prepaid Health Care Act provides superior benefits for the 21 people of Hawaii, and the legislature is wary that current 22 efforts to rescind or amend the federal Affordable Care Act may



1 jeopardize the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act. Therefore, the 2 legislature believes it is imperative to eliminate all 3 provisions for and references to the termination of the Hawaii 4 Prepaid Health Care Act. SECTION 2. Act 99, Session Laws of Hawaii 1994, is hereby 5 6 repealed. 7 SECTION 3. Chapter 393, Part V, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 8 is hereby repealed. SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 9 10
