BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

11	(3)	A person who sells or installs any finished products,

13		actually fabricated into and do not become a permanent
14		fixed part of the structure, or to the construction,
15		alteration, improvement, or repair of personal

17	(4)	Any project or operation for which the aggregate

1 other items, not including materials, is not more than 2 \$1,000. This exemption shall not apply in any case 3 where a building permit is required regardless of the 4 aggregate contract price, nor where the undertaking is 5 only a part of a larger or major project or operation, whether undertaken by the same or a different 6 7 contractor or in which a division of the project or 8 operation is made in contracts of amounts of not more 9 than \$1,000 for the purpose of evading this chapter or 10 otherwise; 11 (5)A registered architect or professional engineer acting 12 solely in the person's professional capacity; 13 (6)Any person who engages in the activities regulated in 14 this chapter as an employee with wages as the person's 15 sole compensation; 16 (7)Owner-builders exempted under section 444-2.5; 17 (8)Any joint venture if all members thereof hold licenses 18 issued under this chapter; 19 (9) Any project or operation where it is determined by the 20 board that less than ten persons are qualified to 21 perform the work in question and that the work does
