A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REPEAT OFFENDERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 706-606.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
