A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 353, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "§353- Contracts with facilities or institutions to hold 5 inmates subject to investigation by ombudsman. Every contract 6 entered into between the department and a correctional facility 7 or institution, including contracts with private or out-of-state 8 entities, shall require the correctional facility or institution 9 to cooperate and participate fully in any investigation of a 10 state correctional facility or contracted facility, as defined under section 96-1, and conducted under chapter 96." 11 12 SECTION 2. Section 96-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted 14 and to read as follows: 15 ""Contracted facility" means any correctional facility or 16 institution with which or for which the department of public 17 safety has contracted to hold inmates, and any officer,

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    exercise of the officer's, employee's, or member's official
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    duties."
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         SECTION 3. Section 96-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending the definition of "agency" to read as
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    follows:
         "(a) "Agency" includes any permanent governmental entity,
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    department, organization, contracted facility, or institution,
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    and any officer, employee, or member thereof acting or
    purporting to act in the exercise of the officer's, employee's,
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    or member's official duties, except:
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              The judiciary and its staff;

              The legislature, its committees, and its staff;

              An entity of the federal government;
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         (4)
              A multistate governmental entity;

              The governor and the governor's personal staff;

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         (8)
              The councils of the various counties."
         SECTION 4. Section 96-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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         "§96-7 Notice to complainant and agency. If the ombudsman
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    decides not to investigate, [he] the ombudsman shall inform the
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    complainant of that decision and shall state [his] the reasons.
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         If the ombudsman decides to investigate, [he] the ombudsman
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    shall notify the complainant of [his] the decision and [he]
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    shall also notify the agency of [his] the intention to
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    investigate."
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         SECTION 5. Section 96-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
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               In an investigation, the ombudsman may make inquiries
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    and obtain information as the ombudsman thinks fit, enter
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    without notice to inspect the premises of an agency, and hold
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    private hearings. If the investigation involves a correctional
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    facility under chapter 353 or a contracted facility, the
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    ombudsman may visit at a suitable hour."
         SECTION 6. Section 353-16.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
         "§353-16.2 Transfer of inmates to out-of-state
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    institutions; ombudsman investigation. (a) The director may
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    effect the transfér of a committed felon to any correctional
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    institution located in another state regardless of whether the
    state is a member of the Western Interstate Corrections Compact;
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- 1 provided that the institution is in compliance with appropriate
- 2 health, safety, and sanitation codes of the state, provides a
- 3 level of program activity for the inmate that is suitable, and
- 4 is operated by that state, by any of its political subdivisions,
- 5 or by a private institution; and provided further that the
- 6 transfer is either:
- 7 (1) In the interest of the security, management of the
- 8 correctional institution where the inmate is presently
- 9 placed, or the reduction of prison overcrowding; or
- 10 (2) In the interest of the inmate.
- 11 -(b) Terms and conditions of the transfer and any
- 12 reimbursement for expenses shall be agreed upon between the
- 13 department and the out-of-state correctional institution prior
- 14 to transfer.
- 15 (c) Any out-of-state correctional facility that has
- 16 custody of committed felons transferred from the Hawaii state
- 17 correctional system shall cooperate and participate fully in any
- 18 investigation of the contracted facility under chapter 96."
- 19 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 for
- 22 any expenses or staffing needs resulting from the ombudsman's



- 1 jurisdiction to investigate the administrative acts of
- 2 contracted facilities, as defined under section 96-1, Hawaii
- 3 Revised Statutes.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of the
- 5 ombudsman for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 8. Sections 1 and 6 shall not be applied so as to
- 7 impair any contract existing as of the effective date of this
- 8 Act in a manner violative of the Hawaii constitution or Article
- 9 I, section 10, of the United States Constitution.
- 10 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
