BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§46-</u> Abandoned real property; includes properties
5	subject to foreclosure. (a) Any county may enact ordinances
6	for the protection and safeguarding of abandoned real property,
7	including the imposition of registration, maintenance, and
8	security requirements upon the owner of the property.
9	(b) Ordinances relating to the registration of abandoned
10	real property shall be limited to properties that are subject to
11	a foreclosure proceeding.
12	(c) Ordinances relating to maintenance shall ensure that
13	owners shall be responsible for maintaining their abandoned real
14	properties in accordance with relevant sanitary codes, building
15	codes, and ordinances relating to external or visible
16	maintenance, including a requirement for owners to perform
17	monthly inspections on the property for the duration of the
18	abandonment.

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1	(d) Ordinances relating to security shall ensure that
2	owners shall be responsible for maintaining their property in a
3	secure manner so as not to be accessible to unauthorized
4	persons, including but not limited to, the following:
5	(1) The closure and locking of windows, doors, gates, and
6	(other openings;
7	(2) The securing of broken windows by reglazing or
8	replacement; and
9	(3) The closure or filling of any excavations or swimming
10	pools.
11	(e) Adherence to the ordinances enacted pursuant to this
12	section shall not relieve owners of the obligation to pay real
13	property taxes on the property or of any applicable obligations
14	set forth elsewhere within any covenants, conditions,
15	restrictions, or homeowner's association bylaws.
16	(f) For the purposes of this section, unless the context
17	indicates otherwise:
18	"Abandoned real property" or "property" means real property
19	that is vacant, under a current notice of default, and is the
20	subject of foreclosure action or proceeding; and:



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1	(1)	Is the subject of a foreclosure sale where the title
2		was retained by the mortgagee involved in the
3		foreclosure; or
4	(2)	Has been transferred under a deed in lieu of
5		foreclosure or sale to the mortgagee.
6	"Own	er" means any person, entity, or service company, who
7	alone or	severally with others:
8	(1)	Has legal or equitable title to any real property,
9		vacant or otherwise;
10	(2)	Has care, charge, or control of any real property in
11		any capacity, including as agent, executor,
12		administrator, trustee, or guardian of the estate of
13		the holder of legal title;
14	(3)	Is a mortgagee in possession of real property; or
15	(4)	Is an agent, trustee, or other person appointed by the
16		courts and vested with possession or control of any
17		real property.
18	"Vaca	ant" means real property that is not legally occupied
19	for more	than thirty days."
