A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTRACTORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 444-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

"§444-9 Licenses required. (a) No person within the 3 4 purview of this chapter shall act, or assume to act, or 5 advertise, as general engineering contractor, general building 6 contractor, or specialty contractor without a license previously 7 obtained under and in compliance with this chapter and the rules 8 and regulations of the contractors license board. 9 In reviewing applications for licensure, the (b) 10 contractors license board shall not consider unlicensed

11 experience in the State or in any other state as a qualification

12 for licensing. If an applicant for licensure resided in a state

13 or foreign jurisdiction that lacks an established contractor

14 licensing system or cannot furnish conclusive evidence of prior

15 licensing in another jurisdiction, the board shall consider the

16 applicant's previous unlicensed work as a qualification for

17 licensure; provided that the board reasonably determines the



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1	applicant has gained sufficient experience within the State
2	prior to submitting the application for licensure."
3	SECTION 2. Section 444-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	<pre>"§444-14 Place of business; state presence; and posting of</pre>
6	license. (a) A licensed contractor shall have, maintain, and
7	operate from a definite place of business in the State and shall
8	display therein his or her contractor's license.
9	(b) The licensed contractor shall report any change of
10	address or telephone number to the contractors license board
11	within ten business days from such change.
12	(c) If a licensed contractor undertakes a project with a
13	proposed duration of eight months or less, as specified in the
14	contract or job specifications, the licensed contractor or the
15	licensed contractor's responsible managing employee shall be
16	present within the State for the entire length of the project,
17	without absence, excluding federal or state holidays. If a
18	licensed contractor undertakes a project with a proposed
19	duration greater than eight months, as specified in the contract
20	or job specifications, the licensed contractor or the licensed
21	contractor's responsible managing employee shall not be absent
22	from the State for more than fourteen calendar days, excluding
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1	federal or state holidays. The contractors license board may
2	consider violations of this subsection when making licensure
3	renewal or reinstatement determinations.
4	(d) For purposes of this section, "responsible managing
5	employee" means an individual who is a bona fide employee of the
6	licensed contractor."
7	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
8	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
9	begun before its effective date.
10	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Contractors License; Contractors License Board; State Presence; Unlicensed Experience

Description:

Prohibits the contractors license board from considering unlicensed experience as a qualification for licensure, with certain exceptions. Requires contractors or their responsible managing employees to be present within the State for certain designated time periods throughout the contract term.
