A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE KAHOOLAWE ISLAND RESERVE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The Kahoolawe island reserve commission is
funded predominantly by a dwindling trust fund created in 1994
during the federal unexploded ordnance cleanup of Kahoolawe.
Although considerable, this federal appropriation, totaling
\$44,000,000 over a period of several years, is not substantial
enough to establish a sustainable endowment for the long-term
restoration of Kahoolawe.

As stated in the federally-mandated Kahoolawe island 8 conveyance commission final report to Congress in 1993, "in the 9 short term, federal funds will provide the bulk of the program 10 support for specific soil conservation projects and related 11 activities. In the longer term, however, state revenues will be 12 needed to continue and enhance those activities initiated with 13 federal funds." For the past sixteen years, federal funding has 14 allowed the Kahoolawe island reserve commission to establish 15 many of its innovative programs that emphasize ancestral and 16 traditional knowledge, provide a cultural approach of respect 17

11	commission. Subject to Public Law 103-139, and this chapter:
