A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Act 173, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009 (Act 173), 1 2 recognized that to develop and finance renewable energy facilities, a site for the facilities and access to the site 3 must often be leased, granted as an easement, or mortgaged to 4 5 provide financing for the project. The purpose of Act 173 was to facilitate the financing and development of renewable energy 6 projects by allowing leases and easements pertaining to 7 renewable energy projects, together with mortgages and other 8 conveyances as security for finance, to be created, enforced, 9 10 and recorded, without requiring the landowner to obtain formal subdivision approval, and instead requiring approval for 11 12 exemption from subdivision requirements, from the applicable 13 county or other approving agency.

14 The need to encourage and facilitate renewable energy 15 facilities in the State persists, but critical sections of Act 16 173 will be repealed on July 1, 2013, unless the legislature 17 acts.
