BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 290-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows:

3 "\$290-2 Notice to owner. (a) Upon taking custody of any

4 abandoned vehicle, a written notice shall immediately be sent by

registered or certified mail to the legal and registered owner

6 of the vehicle at the address on record at the vehicle licensing

7 division. The notice shall contain a brief description of the

8 vehicle, the location of custody, and intended disposition of

9 the vehicle if not repossessed within ten days after the mailing

10 of the notice[-], or, in the case where the address of the

11 registered owner on record at the vehicle licensing division is

12 an out-of-state address, within twenty business days after the

13 <u>mailing of the notice</u>. A notice need not be sent to a legal or

14 registered owner or any person with an unrecorded interest in

15 the vehicle whose name or address cannot be determined. Absent

16 evidence to the contrary, a notice shall be deemed received by

17 the legal or registered owner five days after the mailing.

- (b) For purposes of this section, "business days" shall
- 2 exclude Saturdays, Sundays, and state holidays."
- 3 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.

Extends for registered owners with an out-of-state address, the time period during which the owner of an abandoned vehicle may repossess the vehicle before the vehicle is subject to disposal. Effective January 7, 2059. (HB1241 HD2)
