### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT FUND.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 26-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§26-18 Department of business, economic development, and
4 tourism. (a) The department of business, economic development,
5 and tourism shall be headed by a single executive to be known as
6 the director of business, economic development, and tourism.

7 The department shall undertake statewide business and 8 economic development activities, undertake energy development 9 and management, provide economic research and analysis, plan for 10 the use of Hawaii's ocean resources, and encourage the 11 development and promotion of industry and international commerce 12 through programs established by law.

(b) The following are placed in the department of
business, economic development, and tourism for administrative
purposes as defined by section 26-35: Aloha Tower development
corporation, Hawaii community development authority, Hawaii
housing finance and development corporation, high technology
development corporation, land use commission, natural energy
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1	laboratory of Hawaii authority, and any other boards and		
2	commissions as shall be provided by law.		
3	The department of business, economic development, and		
4	tourism shall be empowered to establish, modify, or abolish

8	director may establish, increase, decrease, or repeal the fees			
9	when necessary pursuant to rules adopted under chapter 91. The

10	governmental agency may be increased or decreased by the body in

12	assessed fee or nontax revenue, to maintain a reasonable			
13	relation between the revenues derived from such fee or nontax			
14	revenue and the cost or value of services rendered,			
15	comparability among fees imposed by the State, or any other			
16	purpose which it may deem necessary and reasonable; provided

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### Report Title:

Business Development Fund; DBEDT; Fees and Costs

#### Description:

Authorizes the director of business, economic development, and tourism to establish fees for services and costs for business development. Establishes the business development fund, from which the director of business, economic development, and tourism may fund the operations of the department.

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
