A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROSTITUTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 712-1207, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§712-1207 Street solicitation of prostitution; designated
4 areas. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person within the
5 boundaries of Waikiki and while on any public property, to offer
6 or agree to engage in sexual conduct with another person in
7 return for a fee.

8 (2) It shall be unlawful for any person within the
9 boundaries of other areas in this State designated by county
10 ordinance pursuant to subsection (3), and while on any public
11 property, to offer or agree to engage in sexual conduct with
12 another person in return for a fee.

13 (3) Upon a recommendation of the chief of police of a14 county, that county may enact an ordinance that:

15 (a) Designates areas, each no larger than three square
16 miles, as zones of significant prostitution-related
17 activity that is detrimental to the health, safety, or
18 welfare of the general public; or



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1 Alters the boundaries of any existing area under (b) 2 paragraph (a); 3 provided that not more than four areas may be designated within 4 the State. 5 (4) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, any person 6 violating this section shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor 7 and shall be sentenced to a mandatory term of thirty days 8 imprisonment. The term of imprisonment shall be imposed 9 immediately, regardless of whether the defendant appeals the 10 conviction, except as provided in subsection (5). (5) As an option to the mandatory term of thirty days 11

imprisonment, if the court finds the option is warranted based 12 upon the defendant's record, the court may place the defendant 13 14 on probation for a period not to exceed six months, subject to 15 the mandatory condition that the defendant observe geographic 16 restrictions that prohibit the defendant from entering or 17 remaining on public property, in Waikiki and other areas in the State designated by county ordinance during the hours from 6 18 19 p.m. to 6 a.m. Upon any violation of the geographic 20 restrictions by the defendant, the court, after hearing, shall 21 revoke the defendant's probation and immediately impose the mandatory thirty-day term of imprisonment. Nothing contained in 22



1 this subsection shall be construed as prohibiting the imposition 2 of stricter geographic restrictions under section 706-624(2)(h). 3 (6) Any person charged under this section may be admitted 4 to bail, pursuant to section 804-4, subject to the mandatory 5 condition that the person observe geographic restrictions that 6 prohibit the defendant from entering or remaining on public 7 property, in Waikiki and other areas in the State designated by 8 county ordinance during the hours from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. 9 Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, any 10 person who violates these bail restrictions shall have the 11 person's bail revoked after hearing and shall be imprisoned 12 forthwith. Nothing contained in this subsection shall be 13 construed as prohibiting the imposition of stricter geographic 14 restrictions under section 804-7.1.

15 (7) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a
16 police officer, without warrant, may arrest any person when the
17 officer has probable cause to believe that the person has
18 committed a violation of subsection (5) or (6), and the person
19 shall be detained, without bail, until the hearing under the
20 appropriate subsection can be held, which hearing shall be held
21 as soon as reasonably practicable.

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L	(8) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the arresting
2	officer may also impound the vehicle of a person violating this
3	chapter if:
4	(A) the motor vehicle was used in the commission of
5	the crime; and
6	(B) the person arrested is the registered owner of
7	the vehicle or the vehicle is a rental vehicle.
8	A county shall establish ordinances for the impoundment and
9	return of motor vehicles and rental vehicles, and may enact
10	reasonable fees for the processing and storage of impounded
11	vehicles under this chapter.
12	[(8)] <u>(9)</u> For purposes of this section:
13	"Area" means any zone within a county that is defined with
14	specific boundaries and designated as a zone of significant
15	prostitution by this section or a county ordinance.
16	"Motor vehicle" means every vehicle which is self-propelled
17	and every vehicle which is propelled by electric power but not
18	operated upon rails.
19	"Public property" includes any street, highway, road,
20	sidewalk, alley, lane, bridge, parking lot, park, or other
21	property owned or under the jurisdiction of any governmental
22	entity or otherwise open to the public.

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1	"Rental vehicle" means a motor vehicle:
2	(1) Of the private passenger type including passenger
3	vans, minivans, and sport utility vehicles; or
4	(2) Of the cargo type, including cargo vans or pickup
5	trucks with a gross vehicle weight of less than
6	twenty-six thousand pounds,
7	that do not require a commercial driver's license for the
8	operation of the vehicle."
9	"Sexual conduct" has the same meaning as in section 712-
10	1200(2).
11	"Waikiki" means that area of Oahu bounded by the Ala Wai
12	canal, the ocean, and Kapahulu avenue.
13	[(9)] <u>(10)</u> This section shall apply to all counties;
14	provided that if a county enacts an ordinance to regulate street
15	solicitation for prostitution, other than an ordinance ${}_{\hat{j}}$
16	designating an area as a zone of significant prostitution-
17	related activity, the county ordinance shall supersede this
18	section and no person shall be convicted under this section in
19	that county."
20	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
21	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
22	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
