# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SMALL BOAT HARBORS.

HB1312 HD2 HMS 2011-2755

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of 2 land and natural resources, through its division of boating and 3 ocean recreation, operates and manages twenty-one harbors, fifty 4 boat ramps, 2,122 moorings and berths, and nineteen piers spread 5 throughout the various counties of the State. The legislature 6 further finds that these ocean recreation facilities, in light 7 of the present demand, are in short supply and in most cases are 8 in dire need of long overdue repair and maintenance. Some 9 facilities are in such disrepair that they cannot be used and 10 are hazards to public safety.

11 One of these facilities, the Ala Wai boat harbor, has been a recent recipient of some badly needed repair and replacement 12 13 of floating docks; however, the need for further maintenance 14 remains unfulfilled. In spite of its needs, the Ala Wai boat 15 harbor includes certain assets within its facilities that are 16 underused and if properly developed could potentially generate 17 revenues that would enable not only its own continued 18 improvement and maintenance but the improvement and maintenance

of the rest of the facilities now operated by the department of
 land and natural resources division of boating and ocean
 recreation.

In these times of economic malaise and with the State
facing a massive budget deficit over the next biennium, a
further decline in the valuable assets of the State's small boat
harbors would be a huge loss that the State cannot allow.

8 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the department of 9 land and natural resources to use the request for proposals 10 process to enter into a public-private partnership for the 11 development of portions of Ala Wai boat harbor facilities that 12 are presently underused, to maximize the revenue potential from 13 those facilities.

SECTION 2. Chapter 200, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

17 "<u>§200- Ala Wai boat harbor; leases.</u> (a) Any lease of
18 the fast lands or submerged lands of the Ala Wai boat harbor
19 issued pursuant to a request for proposals shall be governed by
20 this section.

1 existing state boating facility by public auction, a request for 2 proposals, or by direct negotiation pursuant to section 171-3 59[ $\tau$ ] and chapter 190D, for private development, management, and 4 operation[-]; provided that any lease of fast lands or submerged 5 lands pursuant to a request for proposals shall be subject to 6 the requirements of section 200- (b), (c), and (e) regardless 7 of which boating facility the fast or submerged lands are 8 attached. For the purpose of this section, the term "state 9 boating facility" means a state small boat harbor, launching 10 ramp, offshore mooring, pier, wharf, landing, or any other area 11 under the jurisdiction of the department pursuant to this 12 chapter. 13 (b) The permissible uses under any lease disposed of under 14 this section shall be consistent with the purpose for which the 15 land was set aside by the governor pursuant to section 171-11. 16 Permissible uses may include any use that will complement or 17 support the ocean recreation or maritime activities of state boating facilities. 18 19 Disposition of public lands of state boating (C) facilities constructed, maintained, and operated in accordance 20

21 with this chapter shall not exceed a maximum term of fifty-five 22 years.
