## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CERTAIN FUNDS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 304A-2252, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]§304A-2252[+] Child care programs [revolving] special 4 fund. There is established a child care programs [revolving] 5 special fund for the operation of child care programs 6 established under section 304A-116 and the construction and 7 renovation of child care centers established by the University 8 of Hawaii. Fees charged for child care at child care programs, 9 proceeds from donations to the university for child care 10 programs, and proceeds from loans or other instruments of 11 indebtedness for the construction or renovation of child care 12 centers shall be deposited into the [revolving] special fund. 13 Expenditures from the [revolving] special fund shall be made for 14 the operation of child care programs and payment of principal 15 and interest on obligations incurred for the construction or 16 renovation of child care centers." 17 SECTION 2. Section 304A-2253, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

18 amended as follows:

### 1 1. By amending subsection (a) to read: 2 "(a) There is established a University of Hawaii research 3 and training revolving fund into which shall be deposited one 4 hundred per cent of the total amount of indirect overhead 5 revenues generated by the university from research and training 6 The board of regents is authorized to expend one programs. 7 hundred per cent of the revenues deposited in the fund for: 8 (1)Research and training purposes that may result in 9 additional research and training grants and contracts; 10 (2)Facilitating research and training at the university; 11 and 12 (3)Further deposit into the discoveries and inventions 13 revolving fund [and the University of Hawaii housing 14 assistance revolving fund]." 15 2. By amending subsection (c) to read: 16 "(c) Notwithstanding sections $304A-107[_{T}]$ and 17 [+]304A-2254[], and [304A-2258]] to the contrary, the board of 18 regents or its designee, may establish a separate account within 19 the research and training revolving fund for the purpose of 20 providing advance funding to meet reimbursable costs incurred in connection with federally financed research and training 21 22 projects. 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1 advance funding shall be deposited into the research and 2 training revolving fund to be used for the purpose of meeting 3 reimbursable costs incurred in connection with federally 4 financed projects."

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5 SECTION 3. Section 304A-2254, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended to read as follows:

7 "[+]§304A-2254[+] Discoveries and inventions [revolving] 8 special fund. There is established a discoveries and inventions 9 [revolving] special fund into which shall be deposited a portion 10 of the total indirect overhead funds generated by the university 11 for research and training purposes in the prior fiscal year, as 12 determined by the board of regents. Appropriations by the 13 legislature subject to the approval of the governor, proceeds 14 from the commercial exploitation of inventions and intellectual 15 property developed at the university, gifts, donations, fees 16 collected, and grants from public agencies and private persons 17 may also be deposited into the special fund for the purposes of 18 supporting innovation and research commercialization and the 19 patenting, copyrighting, licensing, and marketing of 20 discoveries, inventions, and technologies developed at the 21 university. The special fund shall be used to develop 22 technologies that have potential commercial value, support the



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administration of technology transfer activities, and facilitate
 economic development through education and research undertaken
 at the university."

4 SECTION 4. Section 304A-2259, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5 amended to read as follows:

6 "[+]§304A-2259[+] University of Hawaii alumni [revolving] 7 **special fund.** There is established the University of Hawaii 8 alumni [revolving] special fund into which shall be deposited 9 funds and proceeds received by the university from alumni 10 activities and donations from alumni. Funds deposited into this 11 [revolving] special fund may be expended by the university for 12 all costs associated with conducting alumni affairs, activities, 13 and programs for the university system, including but not 14 limited to expenses for honoraria, hotel and room rentals, food 15 and refreshment, printing and mailing, banners and signs, 16 plaques and awards, airfare and per diem, leis, rental of 17 audiovisual, musical, and stage equipment, and activity supplies 18 and materials, without regard to statutory competitive bidding 19 requirements."

20 SECTION 5. Section 304A-2261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 21 amended to read as follows:



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1 "[+]§304A-2261[+] University of Hawaii at Manoa 2 intercollegiate athletics [revolving] special fund and University of Hawaii at Hilo intercollegiate athletics 3 [revolving] special fund. Notwithstanding any other law to the 4 5 contrary, there are established the University of Hawaii at 6 Manoa intercollegiate athletics [revolving] special fund and the 7 University of Hawaii at Hilo intercollegiate athletics 8 [revolving] special fund for the intercollegiate athletic 9 programs of the University of Hawaii at Manoa and the University 10 of Hawaii at Hilo, which shall be used to receive, deposit, 11 disburse, and account for funds from the activities of the 12 intercollegiate athletic programs. The university may establish 13 appropriate charges for activities related to its athletic 14 programs and the use of its athletic facilities, the proceeds 15 from which shall be deposited into these [revolving] special 16 funds.

17 The university shall maintain the financial integrity and 18 viability of these [revolving] special funds, including the 19 maintenance of an adequate reserve to cope with the various 20 factors that impact the revenue structure of an intercollegiate 21 athletic program."

1 SECTION 6. Section 304A-2262, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows:

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3 "[+] §304A-2262[+] Animal research farm, Waialee, Oahu 4 [revolving] special fund. There is established the animal 5 research farm, Waialee, Oahu [revolving] special fund for the 6 animal research farm, Waialee, Oahu, operated by the college of 7 tropical agriculture and human resources of the University of 8 Hawaii, into which shall be deposited the receipts from fees 9 realized from the sale of livestock, services, and supplies. 10 Funds deposited into this [revolving] special fund shall be 11 expended for animal research, and services and supplies related 12 thereto."

13 SECTION 7. Section 304A-2271, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended to read as follows:

15 "[+]§304A-2271[+] University of Hawaii-Hilo theatre 16 [revolving] special fund. There is established the University 17 of Hawaii-Hilo theatre [revolving] special fund, which shall consist of admissions, advertising sales, corporate 18 19 sponsorships, marketing, merchandising, donations, fund-raising, 20 fees, charges, and other moneys collected in conjunction with 21 the University of Hawaii-Hilo theatre program. The [revolving] special fund shall be administered by the office of 22



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1 administrative affairs of the University of Hawaii at Hilo. 2 Funds may be expended for all costs associated with the theatre 3 program, including artists' fees, production costs, personnel 4 costs, honoraria, per diem, hotel and room rentals, food and 5 refreshments, printing and mailing, advertising, airfare, leis, 6 rental or purchase of equipment, and theater supplies and 7 materials." 8 SECTION 8. Section 304A-2158, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 repealed.

10 ["[§304A-2158] Western Governors University special fund. 11 There is established a Western Covernors University special fund 12 into which shall be deposited all revenues derived from the 13 State's participation in the Western Covernors University, 14 except University of Hawaii income from tuition and fees charged 15 for regular courses of instruction and tuition-related course 16 and fee charges to students. The fund shall be administered by 17 the board of regents of the University of Hawaii and shall be 18 used for the State's membership and participation in the Western 19 Covernors University."] 20 SECTION 9. Section 304A-2258, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

21 repealed.

9 SECTION 17. The conversion of revolving funds to special
10 funds pursuant to sections 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of this Act
11 shall in no way be construed as an authorization to remove,
12 alter, or amend any moneys from any revolving fund other than
13 for the purposes of this Act and for the allowable uses under
14 relevant law.

15 SECTION 18. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 19. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

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#### Report Title:

University of Hawaii; Special Funds; Revolving Funds

#### Description:

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Converts certain revolving funds of the University of Hawaii into special funds. Repeals certain funds of the University of Hawaii and transfers the remaining balances to specified alternate funds. Effective on July 1, 2050. (SD1)

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
