A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECI	ION 1. Section 37-74, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
3	" (d)	No appropriation transfers or changes between
4	programs	or agencies shall be made without legislative
5	authoriza	tion; provided that:
6	(1)	Authorized transfers or changes, when made, shall be
7		reported to the legislature;
8	(2)	Except with respect to appropriations to fund
9		financing agreements under chapter 37D, the University
10		of Hawaii shall have the flexibility to transfer
11		appropriated funds and positions for the operating
12		cost category among programs, among cost elements in a
13		program, and between quarters, as applicable; except
14		with respect to appropriations to fund financing
15		agreements under chapter 37D, the department of
16		education shall have the flexibility to transfer
17		appropriated funds and positions for the operating
18		cost category among programs and among cost elements
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1 in a program, and between quarters, as applicable; and 2 the Hawaii health systems corporation and its regional 3 system boards shall have the flexibility to transfer 4 special fund appropriations among regional system 5 hospital facilities as applicable and as mutually 6 agreed to by the corporation and the respective 7 regional system board; provided that the Hawaii health 8 systems corporation and the regional system boards 9 shall maintain the integrity and services of each 10 individual regional system and shall not transfer 11 appropriations out of any regional system that would 12 result in a reduction of services offered by the 13 regional system, with due regard for statutory 14 requirements, changing conditions, the needs of the 15 programs, and the effective utilization of resources; 16 and

17 (3) The [university and the] department of education shall
18 account for each transfer implemented under this
19 subsection in quarterly reports to the governor and
20 annual reports at the end of each fiscal year to the
21 legislature and the governor, which shall be prepared
22 in the form and manner prescribed by the governor and
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1 shall include information on the sources and uses of 2 the transfer." 3 SECTION 2. Section 304A-106, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 5 "(c) The board of regents shall cause to be kept suitable 6 books of account wherein shall be recorded each gift, the 7 essential facts of the management thereof, and the expenditure 8 of the income. [A statement of all trust funds shall be 9 included in the annual report to the governor and the 10 legislature.]" 11 SECTION 3. Section 304A-2159, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows: 13 "[+] §304A-2159[+] University of Hawaii scholarship and 14 assistance special fund. (a) There is established the 15 University of Hawaii scholarship and assistance special fund to 16 be administered by the University of Hawaii. The special fund 17 shall be administered pursuant to the authority of the board of 18 regents to grant, modify, or suspend the scholarship and 19 assistance under section [+]304A-501[+]. [This] The University 20 of Hawaii scholarship and assistance special fund shall be used 21 to provide financial assistance to qualified students enrolled 22 at any campus of the University of Hawaii.



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1 Revenues deposited into this fund shall include but (b) 2 not be limited to state, federal, and private funds, funds 3 transferred by the university from the tuition and fees special **4** fund pursuant to section [+]304A-2153[+], and appropriations for 5 the state scholars program; provided that state funds 6 appropriated for any scholarship program, including but not 7 limited to the B Plus scholarship program, the Hawaii state 8 scholars program, and the workforce development scholarship 9 program, shall be kept in a separate and distinct account. 10 [-(c) The annual report for the special fund shall include 11 but not be limited to the number of tuition waivers. 12 scholarships, and stipends. The report shall also include but 13 not be limited to the number of tuition waivers granted under section [304A-503] -through the Hawaii opportunity program in 14 15 education. The report shall also include recommendations as 16 appropriate to the legislature on all tuition waivers. 17 (d) This] (c) The University of Hawaii scholarship and 18 assistance special fund is not intended to provide loans or keep 19 track of payback provisions." 20 SECTION 4. Section 304A-2273, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

21 amended to read as follows:

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"[+] §304A-2273[+] Community college conference center 1 revolving fund. [(a)] There is established the community 2 college conference center revolving fund for conference center 3 programs conducted by the various community colleges. All fees, 4 charges, and other moneys collected in conjunction with the 5 conference center program of each community college shall be 6 deposited in separate accounts within the revolving fund. 7 The chancellor of each community college or a designee is authorized 8 9 to expend funds from the appropriate account in the revolving fund for all costs associated with conducting conferences, 10 11 seminars, and courses by the conference center program, 12 including but not limited to expenses for honoraria, hotel and room rentals, food and refreshment, printing and mailing, 13 airfare and per diem, leis, rental of audiovisual equipment, and 14 conference supplies and materials, without regard to section 15 103D-1002 and any competitive bidding requirements pursuant to 16 17 state procurement requirements.

18 [(b) The chancellors of the community colleges shall 19 prepare an annual report to the legislature accounting for all 20 income and expenditures of each separate account within the 21 revolving fund.]"

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SECTION 5. Section 304A-3205, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+] §304A-3205[+] Expenditures; reports. Expenditures by 4 the commission, including the amounts fixed annually as the equal contribution of each member to the compact, shall be made 5 upon warrants issued by the state comptroller based upon 6 vouchers approved by any one of the commissioners. A report of 7 the activities and expenses of the commissioners and a proposed 8 program for the State's continuing participation in the 9 activities of the Western Interstate Commission for Higher 10 Education, including a budget request, shall be submitted by the 11 commissioners to the legislature [for] each regular legislative 12 13 session[-] in an odd-numbered year."

SECTION 6. Section 304A-1004, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is repealed.

16 ["{\$304A-1004} Annual report; executive, managerial, and 17 faculty salaries. The board of regents shall submit an annual 18 report to the legislature containing the salaries paid to all 19 executive, managerial, and faculty members of the university, 20 including that paid to the president of the university, not 21 fewer than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular 22 session."]



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SECTION 7. Section 304A-1144, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 repealed.

3	["[\$304A-1144] Annual report. The office of the vice	
4	president for community colleges shall prepare an annual report	
5	to the legislature on the status of the program. This annual	
6	report shall include data on the development of the construction	
7	academy-curriculum and content, teaching-standards throughout	
8	the system, and overall achievement. The annual report shall be	
9	submitted no later than twenty days prior to the convening of	
10	each regular legislative session."]	
11	SECTION 8. Section 304A-2689, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
12	repealed.	
13	[" [\$304A-2689] Annual report. The University of Hawaii	
14	shall submit a report to the legislature, no later than twenty	
15	days-prior-to the convening of each regular-session, of all	
16	revenue bonds issued pursuant to this subpart. The report shall	
17	provide a summary of all revenue bonds issued pursuant to this	
18	subpart during the preceding fiscal year."]	
19	SECTION 9. Section 304A-3305, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
20	repealed.	
21	["[\$304A-3305] Annual report. The University of Hawaii	

22 shall publish a report by September 1, 2006, and every year

22	in 2008. –	A major purpose of the annual incentive and
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1	performan	nce-report and plan is to assist the legislature in	
2	appropriating up to two per cent of the University of Hawaii's		
3	annual budget-to facilitate the university's strategic plan and		
4	related state goals.		
5	(b)	The 2008 incentive and performance report and plan	
6	shall-pre	esent University of Hawaii and state workforce	
7	quantitat	ive information that form the baseline data for future	
8	comparise	ons. The university shall include at least the	
9	following	baseline data for the past five years by program,	
10	departmen	t, campus, and university:

5	(c) Beginning in 2009, the incentive and performance		
6	report and plan shall continue to provide the quantitative data,		
7	as-well-as a qualitative data analysis of the success of the		
8	endeavors to enroll, transfer, and graduate students and how		
9	this objective is matching the university's strategic plan and		
10	the state's workforce needs. The allocation of up to two per		
11	cent of incentive and performance funds shall be based on these		
12	results.		
13	(d) The University of Hawaii shall include within its		
14	strategic plan measurable goals and performance data.		
15	(c) The University of Hawaii shall collect and maintain		
16	benchmark data in keeping with section 304A-2001, Hawaii Revised		
17	Statutes.		
18	(f) The annual incentive and performance report shall		
19	describe the success of previous incentive and performance plans		
20	by analyzing the outcome performance measures in relation to		
21	plan goals. The report shall also propose the following year's		
22	incentive and performance plan, including identifying the goals,		
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1	performance-outcome-measures, and sources of funding, which may
2	include new general fund appropriations, reallocated existing
3	general fund appropriations, and other sources of funding
4	available to the university. Data appropriate to the individual
5	performance-measure-shall-be-provided-in-the-annual-report."]
6	SECTION 11. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
7	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
8	SECTION 12. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
