### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYEES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that identity theft is an
- 2 increasingly frequent crime with crippling effects on the
- 3 finances and credit of individuals and businesses. Identity
- 4 theft occurs when personal information, such as names, social
- 5 security numbers, credit card numbers, and other information are
- 6 stolen or obtained and used to commit fraud or other crimes.
- 7 The department of the attorney general reported over 1,302 cases
- 8 or incidents of identity theft in the State in 2008. The
- 9 Honolulu Police Department alone reported that its financial
- 10 fraud unit received over five hundred new cases of identity
- 11 theft in 2009. Due to the increased use of the Internet for
- 12 purchasing goods and services, completing bank and other
- 13 financial transactions, social communication, and business
- 14 transactions, people have become increasingly wary of the risk
- 15 of identity theft.
- 16 In 2009, a local online news service made several requests
- 17 for information on state employees' salaries, which were later
- 18 published on the online news website. In many instances, the

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- 1 employee's name and specific salary were listed, causing concern
- 2 that the availability of the information could place employees
- 3 at greater risk of identity theft and raising other privacy
- 4 issues.
- 5 While the legislature acknowledges the importance of open
- 6 government and the disclosure of certain types of information
- 7 for public inspection, it also recognized the need to balance
- 8 open government with the right to privacy when it enacted the
- 9 Uniform Information Practices Act in 1988. In light of the
- 10 increasing risk of identity theft in recent years, the
- 11 legislature finds that the Uniform Information Practices Act
- 12 should be modified to provide greater privacy protections for
- 13 state and county employees while preserving the intent of the
- 14 law to promote the public's access to certain types of
- 15 information.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to amend the name and
- 17 compensation disclosure requirement for state and county
- 18 employees.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 92F-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

4	(1)	Rules of procedure, substantive rules of general
5		applicability, statements of general policy, and
6		interpretations of general applicability adopted by

8	(2)	Final opinions, including concurring and dissenting
9		opinions, as well as orders made in the adjudication
10		of cases, except to the extent protected by section
11		92F-13(1);
12	(3)	Government purchasing information, including all bid
13		results, except to the extent prohibited by section
14		92F-13;
15	(4)	Pardons and commutations, as well as directory
16		information concerning an individual's presence at any
17		correctional facility;
18	(5)	Land ownership, transfer, and lien records, including
19		real property tax information and leases of state
20		land;
21	(6)	Results of environmental tests;

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1	(7)	Minutes of all agency meetings required by law to be
2		public;
3	(8)	Name, address, and occupation of any person borrowing
4		funds from a state or county loan program, and the
5		amount, purpose, and current status of the loan;
6	(9)	Certified payroll records on public works contracts
7		except social security numbers and home addresses;
8	(10)	Regarding contract hires and consultants employed by
9		agencies:
10		(A) The contract itself, the amount of compensation;
11		(B) The duration of the contract; and
12		(C) The objectives of the contract,
13		except social security numbers and home addresses;
14	(11)	Building permit information within the control of the
15		agency;
16	(12)	Water service consumption data maintained by the
17		boards of water supply;
18	(13)	Rosters of persons holding licenses or permits granted
19		by an agency that may include name, business address,
20		type of license held, and status of the license;
21	(14)	The [name, compensation (but only the salary range for
22		employees covered by or included in chapter 76, and

1		sections 302A 602 to 302A-640, and 302A-701, or
2		bargaining unit (8) of an agency), job title, business
3		address, business telephone number, job description,
4		education and training background, previous work
5		experience, dates of first and last employment,
6		position number, type of appointment, service
7		computation date, occupational group or class code,
8		bargaining unit code, employing agency name and code,
9		department, division, branch, office, section, unit,
10		and island of employment, job title and salary range
11		of present or former officers or employees of the
12		agency; provided that this paragraph shall not require
13		the creation of a roster of employees; and provided
14		further that this paragraph shall not apply to
15		information regarding present or former employees
16		involved in an undercover capacity in a law
17		enforcement agency;
18	(15)	Information collected and maintained for the purpose
19		of making information available to the general public;
20		and

1	(16) Information contained in or compiled from a
2	transcript, minutes, report, or summary of a
3	proceeding open to the public."
4	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
