A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAII-GROWN PRODUCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "§302A- Farm-to-school program. (a) There is 5 established in the department of agriculture a farm-to-school 6 program. The purpose of the program is to increase procurement of locally-grown fruits and vegetables by public schools. 7 8 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the department of agriculture, in consultation with 9 the departments of health, accounting and general services, and 10 11 education as necessary, may: Coordinate the identification and development of 12 (1) 13 policies and procedures to implement and evaluate the farm-to-school program; 14 15 (2) Assist in marketing Hawaii-grown produce to schools by informing Hawaii food growers and distributors of food 16 procurement opportunities, bid procedures, school 17 purchasing criteria, and other requirements; 18 1792 HB1380 SD1 SMA-1.doc

12		nutritional, environmental, and economic benefits of
13		preparing and consuming Hawaii-grown produce;
14	(6)	Support efforts to advance other farm-to-school
15		connections such as farmers markets on school grounds,
16		school gardens, and community-supported agriculture;

18	(7)	Seek additional private and public funds to leverage
19		any appropriations.
20	(C)	As used in this section:
21	<u>"Haw</u>	aii-grown produce" means fruits and vegetables grown or
22	raised in	the State that are unprocessed, minimally processed,

2	their fre	shness while providing convenience to the user.
3	<u>"Min</u>	imally processed foods" means food that has only been
4	cleaned,	washed, cut, or portioned."
5	SECT	ION 2. (a) There shall be established a Hawaii-grown
6	produce i	n schools task force to be placed within the department
7	of agricu	lture for administrative purposes only.
8	(b)	The task force shall:
9	(1)	Examine the feasibility of establishing school gardens
10		to grow food for consumption as part of each school's
11	•	lunch program, specifically looking at food safety
12		certification issues;
13	(2)	Examine the feasibility of establishing a Hawaii-grown

15		the United States Department of Agriculture Fresh

18	(3)	Advise the department of agriculture in the creation
