### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that non-recyclable non-2 compostable plastic bags present a hazard to the natural 3 environment. Plastic bags significantly impact the environment, 4 including contributing to unsightly litter, crowding landfills 5 with nonbiodegradable waste, endangering marine animals, and 6 requiring the use of millions of barrels of crude oil for their 7 manufacture. The legislature further finds that the State has 8 an interest in protecting its natural environment and decreasing 9 the amount of waste in landfills.

10 The purpose of this Act is to encourage the use of 11 environmentally preferable alternatives to nonbiodegradable 12 plastic bags.

13 SECTION 2. Chapter 342H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
15 to read as follows:

16 "PART . USE OF RECYCLABLE PLASTIC BAGS
 17 §342H- Definitions. As used in this part, unless the
 18 context otherwise requires:



"ASTM standard" means the American Society for Testing and
 Materials International standard 06400 for compostable plastic,
 as amended.

Business" means any commercial enterprise or
establishment, including sole proprietorships, joint ventures,
partnerships, and corporations, or any other legally cognizable
entity, whether for profit or not for profit, and includes all
employees of the business or any independent contractors
associated with the business.

10 "Checkout bag" means a carryout bag that is provided by a11 store to a customer.

"Compostable" means that the product or package meets
American Society for Testing and Materials International
standards for compostability.

15 "Compostable plastic bag" means a plastic bag that will 16 break down into, or otherwise become part of, usable compost, 17 including soil-conditioning material and mulch, in a safe and 18 timely manner.

19 "Department" means the department of the health.

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"Director" means the director of health.



1 "Person" means an individual, trust, firm, joint stock 2 company, corporation, cooperative, partnership, limited 3. liability company, or association. 4 "Post-consumer recycled material" means materials that is 5 an end product that has completed its life cycle as a consumer 6 item such as office paper, cardboard, and aluminum cans. 7 "Recyclable" means material that can be sorted, cleansed, 8 and reconstituted using available recycling collection programs 9 for the purpose of using the altered form in the manufacture of 10 a new product. Recycling does not include burning, 11 incinerating, converting, or otherwise thermally destroying 12 solid waste. 13 "Recyclable paper bag" means a paper bag that: 14 (1) Contains no old growth fiber; 15 (2) Is one hundred per cent recyclable and contains a 16 minimum of forty per cent post-consumer recycled 17 material; and 18 (3) Displays the words "Recyclable" in a highly visible manner on the outside of the bag. 19 20 "Reusable bag" means a bag with handles that is 21 specifically designed and manufactured for multiple reuse and 22 is:



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1	(1)	Made of cloth or other machine washable fabric; or
2	(2)	Made of other durable material suitable for re-use,
3		including plastic that is at least 2.25 millimeters

15	§342F	I- Rules. The director shall adopt rules under
16	chapter 91	to effectuate the purpose of this part.
17	§342B	I- Administrative penalties. The director is
18	authorized	to impose by order the following administrative
19	penalties	for violations of this part:
20	(1)	For a first violation, a fine of not more than \$200;
21	(2)	For a second violation within one year, a fine of not
22		more than \$400; and

(3) For a third or subsequent violation within one year, a		
fine of not more than \$600.		
§342H- Injunctive and other relief. The director may		
institute a civil action in any court of competent jurisdiction		
for injunctive and other relief to prevent any violation of this		
part, any rule adopted pursuant to this part, to collect		
administrative penalties, or to obtain other relief. The court		
shall have the power to grant relief."		
SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that		
matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were		
begun, before its effective date.		
SECTION 4. Nothing in this Act shall be interpreted or		
applied so as to create any requirement, power, or duty in		
conflict with any federal law.		
SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
