A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 222, Hawaiian Homes Commission Act,
1920, as amended, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read
as follows:

4 "(a) The department may make such expenditures and shall 5 adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as are necessary for the efficient execution of the 6 7 functions vested in the department by this Act. A11 expenditures of the department and all moneys necessary for 8 9 loans made by the department, in accordance with the provisions 10 of this Act, shall be allowed and paid upon the presentation of 11 itemized vouchers approved by the chairman of the commission or 12 the chairman's designated representative. The department shall 13 make an annual report to the legislature of the State upon the first day of each regular session and such special reports as 14 15 the legislature may from time to time require. The annual 16 report shall include information concerning:

(1) The total number of homestead lots awarded;

11	The [chairman] chairperson and members of the commission shall	
12	give bond as required by law. The sureties upon the bond and	
13	the conditions thereof shall be approved regularly by the

15 .	SECTION 2. The department of Hawaiian home lands shall	
16	report to the legislature, no later than twenty days prior to	
17	the convening of the 2012 regular session, on the homestead lots	
18	awarded each year, as reported in the department's annual	
19	reports between the years of 2002 and 2009. The report shall	
20	include information concerning:	
21	(1)	The total number of homestead lots awarded;

11	SECT	ION 3. The director of finance is authorized to issue	
12	general obligation bonds in the sum of \$300,000 or so much		
13	thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof		
14	as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2011-2012		
15	for the purpose of building the water infrastructure system		
16	designed by the Honokaia ohana to support ranching activity on		
17	the Honokaia homestead tract in Waimea, Hawaii.		
18	SECTION 4. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the		
19	department of Hawaiian home lands for the purposes of this Act.		
20	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.		



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SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
provided that sections 3 and section 4 shall take effect on
July 1, 2011.
