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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds education to be of vital 2 importance to the progress and well-being of the State. Ensuring access to higher education with state moneys is and 3 shall remain a priority. However, the legislature finds that 4 5 with the diminishing revenue and financial difficulties faced by 6 the State, careful review of all government spending is necessary. The cost to the State of each full time 7 8 undergraduate student in the university system exceeds \$15,000 9 per year. Many of these students have surpassed the number of 10 credits needed to graduate and extend their matriculation well 11 beyond the normal four-year time period.

12 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 14 and to read as follows:

# 15 "<u>§304A-</u> <u>Annual reports of excessive undergraduate</u> 16 <u>credits; assessments.</u> The University of Hawaii shall submit a 17 report to the director of finance no later than August 30, 2011,

2	assessed to the general fund of the State. Notwithstanding any
3	other law to the contrary, the assessment may be paid from

6	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
7	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.

Assessment; Director of Finance; Tuition; University of Hawaii

#### Description:

Requires the University of Hawaii to report annually to the Director of Finance the number of students in the previous academic year who attended and were in excess of the necessary credits for graduation or prior to declaring a major. Authorizes the Director of Finance to assess and transfer the costs. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB1457 HD1)
