A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The efficient and secure movement of SECTION 1. 2 agricultural commodities -- whether imported into the State, 3 exported out of the State, or transported between the islands of 4 the State--is key to the long-term viability of Hawaii's 5 agriculture industry. Inefficiencies in cargo transportation increase the cost of goods and raise the risk of spoilage and 6 7 loss. Consumers and retailers demand safe food products; farmers and wholesalers follow food-safety guidelines and 8 9 regulations. The transportation of agricultural commodities 10 from producer to consumer cannot be the weak link in the system.

11 The inspection and proper treatment of incoming and 12 outgoing commodities reduce the probability of the introduction 13 of new pests to Hawaii's agricultural industry and reduces the 14 likelihood of a quarantine on Hawaii's exported goods.

15 The purpose of this Act is to initiate and continue the 16 implementation of biosecurity facilities at Hawaii's ports and 17 applicable off-port locations. These facilities would be in

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1	SECTION 2. Chapter 206J, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is							
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated							
3	and to read as follows:							
4	"206J- Biosecurity and inspection facilities. The							
5	development corporation shall provide space, planning and design							
6	support, and other infrastructure at the Aloha Tower complex to							
7	the department of agriculture for biosecurity and inspection							
8	facilities to provide for the inspection, consolidation,							
9	deconsolidation, and treatment of agricultural commodities to							
10	meet the various needs of the island of Oahu's agricultural							
11	industry."							
12	SECTION 3. Chapter 261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is							
13	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated							
14	and to read as follows:							
15	"261- Biosecurity and inspection facilities. The							
16	department shall provide space, planning and design support, and							
17	other infrastructure at Honolulu International Airport, Hilo							
18	International Airport, Kona International Airport at Keahole,							
19	Kahului Airport, and Lihue Airport to the department of							
20	agriculture for biosecurity and inspection facilities to provide							
21	for the inspection, consolidation, deconsolidation, and							



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1	treatment of agricultural commodities to meet the various needs					
2	of each island's agricultural industries."					
3	SECTION 4. Chapter 266, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is					
4	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated					
5	and to read as follows:					
6	"266- Biosecurity and inspection facilities. The					
7	department of transportation shall provide space, planning and					
8	design support, and other infrastructure at Honolulu Harbor,					
9	Hilo Harbor, Kawaihae Harbor, Kahului Harbor, and Nawiliwili					
10	Harbor to the department of agriculture for biosecurity and					
11	inspection facilities to provide for the inspection,					
12	consolidation, deconsolidation, and treatment of agricultural					
13	commodities to meet the various needs of each island's					
14	agricultural industries."					
15	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general					
16	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much					
17	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and the					
18	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year					
19	2012-2013 for the department of agriculture to reimburse in full					
20	the department of transportation and the Aloha Tower development					
21	corporation, as applicable, for their assistance and support to					
22	the department of agriculture in establishing biosecurity and					
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inspection facilities at the locations described in sections 2,
3, and 4 of this Act.

3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department4 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.

6 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
